Charles Sentelle Takes Own Life Following Arrest

Charles Hyatt Sentelle, 48, of Bethel took his own life by strangulation early Monday night, shortly after being placed in the Haywood County jail, according to Dr. J. Frank Pate of Canton, county coroner.

Sheriff Fred Campbell said that Sentelle was placed in a jail cell alone about 7 p.m. and was found dead at 8 p.m. by Jailer Cordell Evans.

The sheriff explained that Sentelle sat on the lower half of a double-decker bunk, hooked his belt on the upper portion and strangled himself by leaning backward.

Sentelle was arrested Monday evening by Cpl. Pritchard Smith and Patrolman W. R. Wooten on charges of driving drunk after his car was involved in an accident on Highway 276 near the Louis Siler residence with another vehicle driven by Mrs. J. Elmer Harris of Waynesville.

The Sentelle car struck the other from the rear, causing damages of about \$100 to both vehicles, the patrolmen said.

Funeral services were held this afternoon in the Bethel Methodist Church.

The Rev. Archie Graham, pastor of the Bethel Presbyterian Church, officiated and was assisted by the Rev. Tom Erwin, the Rev. Charlie Owen, and the Rev. L. B. George.

Interment was in Bethel Cemetery. Pallbearers were C. S. Terrell, J. E. Justice, R. B. Smathers, L. G. Sentelle, Morris Bumgarner, and Lonnie Smith.

Surviving are the wife, Mrs. Bernice Calvin Sentelle; two sons, Charles Harris, Jr. of San Antonio, Tex., and Cpl. William Stuart Sentelle of the U. S. Army.

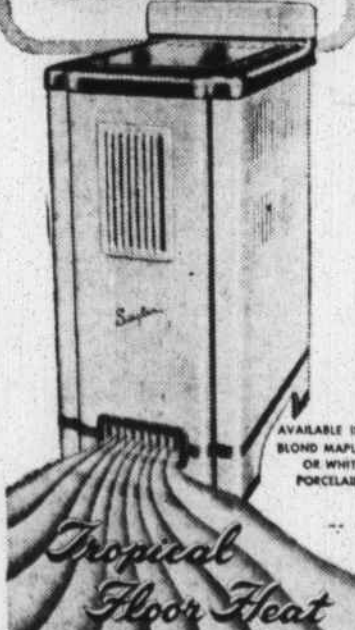
