Dr. Madison, Founder Of WCC, Dies At 87

Dr. Robert Lee Madison, founder of Western Carolina College at Cullowhee, died Friday morning in a Waynesville nursing home at the age of 87. During an illness of three years he had lost his sight and become bedridden.

A native of Lexington, Va., Dr. Madison came to Western North Carolina as a young man with a dream of establishing schools and giving the mountain boys and girls an opportunity for education.

This was the beginning of what is now Western Carolina College.

Dr. Madison served the college until about 10 years ago when he was forced to retire because of declining health.

He was the son of Col. Robert Lewis Madison, physician to General Robert E. Lee.

Hundreds of students who attended Professor Madison's classes will remember that his greatest joy and delight was of relating his personal experiences with Robert E. Lee. He was a great-nephew of James Monroe Madison, fourth president of the United States.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon in Hoey Auditorium at W.C.C. with Dr. A. Rufus Morgan of Franklin, officiating. Members of the Masonic Order were pallbearers and conducted graveside rites.

Dr. Madison married Miss Ella Virginia Richards of Elizabeth, N. J. in 1891. She died Dec. 18, 1948, after assisting her husband for many years as a teacher in the college and an adviser in his work.

Six children were born to the couple. They were Robert Edward James Ambrose, Dr. William Madison John Bonister, Monroe Bollinger and Mrs. Annie Madison Reed. The first three sons preceded him in death.

Bethel Blue Demons Nose Out Candler Bobcats 7-13

Trailing in every department but the one that counts most—scoring—Bethel's Blue Demons took a 13-7 victory over Candler's Bobcats in Canton Saturday night.

Bethel pushed across counters in the first and second quarters but were forced to take a back seat during the last half as Candler completely dominated the play.

The Bobcats rolled up 11 first downs to Bethel's two in the last half and threatened three times but were able to score only once, early in the fourth.

Late in the first quarter, Bethel out Candler in a hole when Worth Wells punted 54 yards deep on the Candler one-foot line. Candler then kicked out to the 32.

Charlie Stamey and Toby Capps worked the ball to a first down on the Candler five and Troy Hargrove charged over tackle for the touchdown. Stamey added the extra point on a line play.

Wells recovered a Candler fumble on the Candler 47 to set up the second quarter Bethel score. Stamey and Capps carried to the 11 and Hargrove plowed through center for 10 more. Harold Ledbetter plowed over from the one for the touchdown.

Candler was stopped after a 56-yard drive in the third quarter but late in the period launched a 63-yard march that paid off in a touchdown early in the fourth. Lee Farmer was the sparkplug in the drive that went all the way on the ground. Marvin Guy scored from the four and Teddy Luther ran the extra point.

The Bobcats set a navdirt again late in the period and were on the two when the final horn sounded.

Sylva High's Hurricanes rolled up 293 yards on the ground and 187 in the air to swan Clyde High, 48-0, on a rain-soaked gridiron in Sylva Friday night.

Charles Reed, pride of the Hurricane backfield, was the offensive spark. He ran for two touchdowns and passed for three more.

In the opening minutes of the game Reed ripped off a 75-yard run to give Sylva its first score. Before the quarter ended he pitched to Bobby Henson for a 45-yard marker.

Reed's more most sensational play of the night however, came in the second period when he ran 99 yards after the Hurricanes were backed up to their one-yard-stripe by a penalty.

The home team led 19-0 at the half.

In the last half Reed threw two touchdown passes to Henson, Billy Rogers made the other score on a five-yard plunge.

Man Killed In Highway Mishap

Dr. A. Heyward Smith, Jr., was said by officers to have been the driver of a car which struck and killed a man about 8 o'clock Thursday night near Morganton. Will Arney of Glen Alpine was killed instantly when he was struck by Dr. Smith's 1954 Buick.

Harry Setzer, assistant Burke County coroner, who assisted in the investigation, said he was told by C. B. Gibbs of Morganton that Arney was sitting in the middle of U. S. Highway 70 when Gibbs drove past.

Gibbs stopped at a nearby service station and called the Burke County sheriff's office and returned to investigate.

However, the Smith car came along before Gibbs was back at the scene and hit Arney. State Highway Patrolman T. J. Greene said.

Setzer said death was the result of a crushed skull, broken right leg, shoulder and collar bone and possible internal injuries.

No car had been filed against Dr. Smith, who was accompanied by his wife, pending completion of the investigation. Patrolman Greene said.
