LESSON SHOWS THE CONTRAST BETWEEN THE WISE AND THE FOOLISH MAN

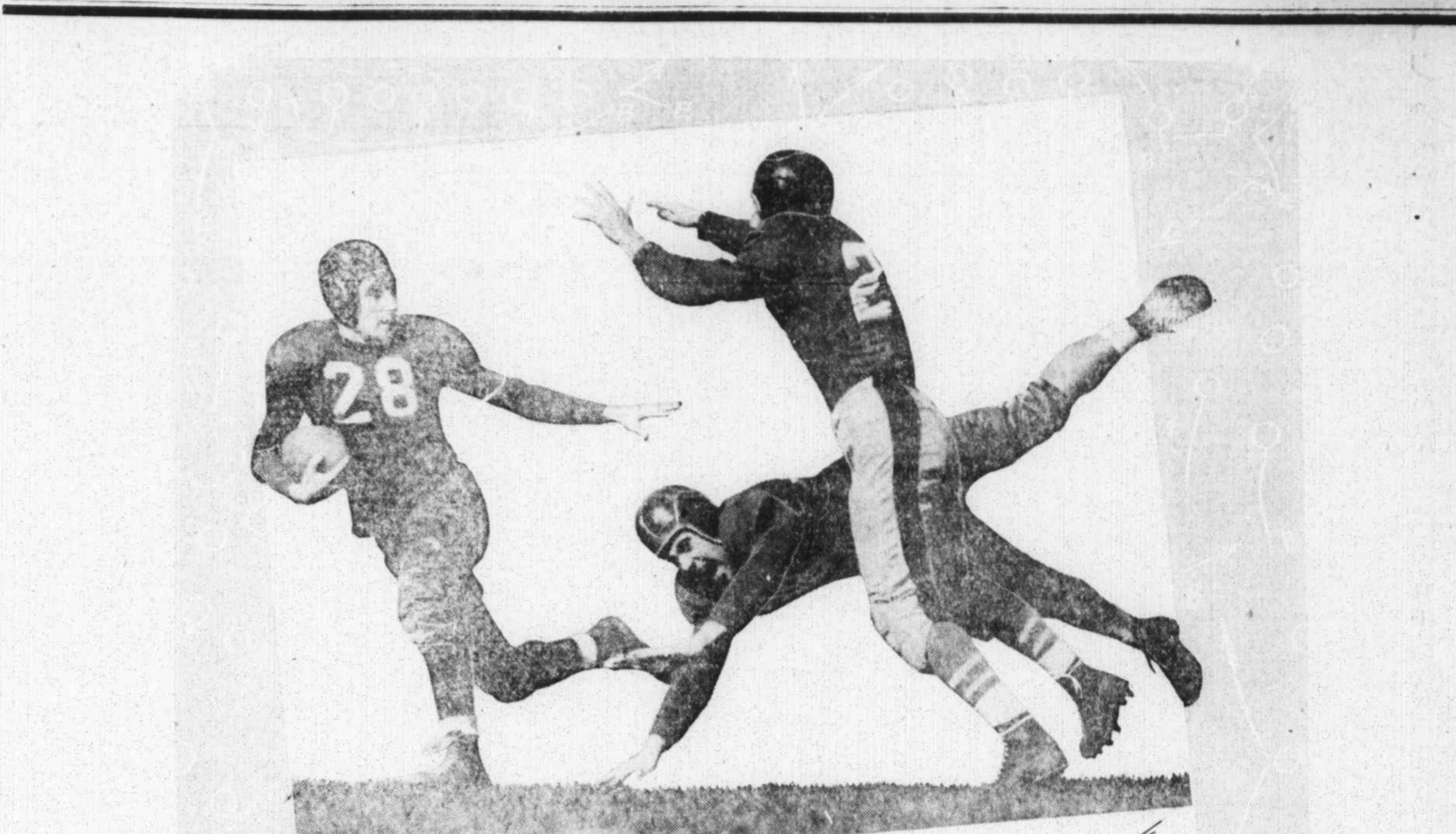
Scripture—Proverbs 11: 15-16; 18; 20; 23; 29-35; 37.
