Mrs. Eugene Parker of Clyde was matron of honor. She wore a ballerina length gown of net over taffeta, and carried an orchid.

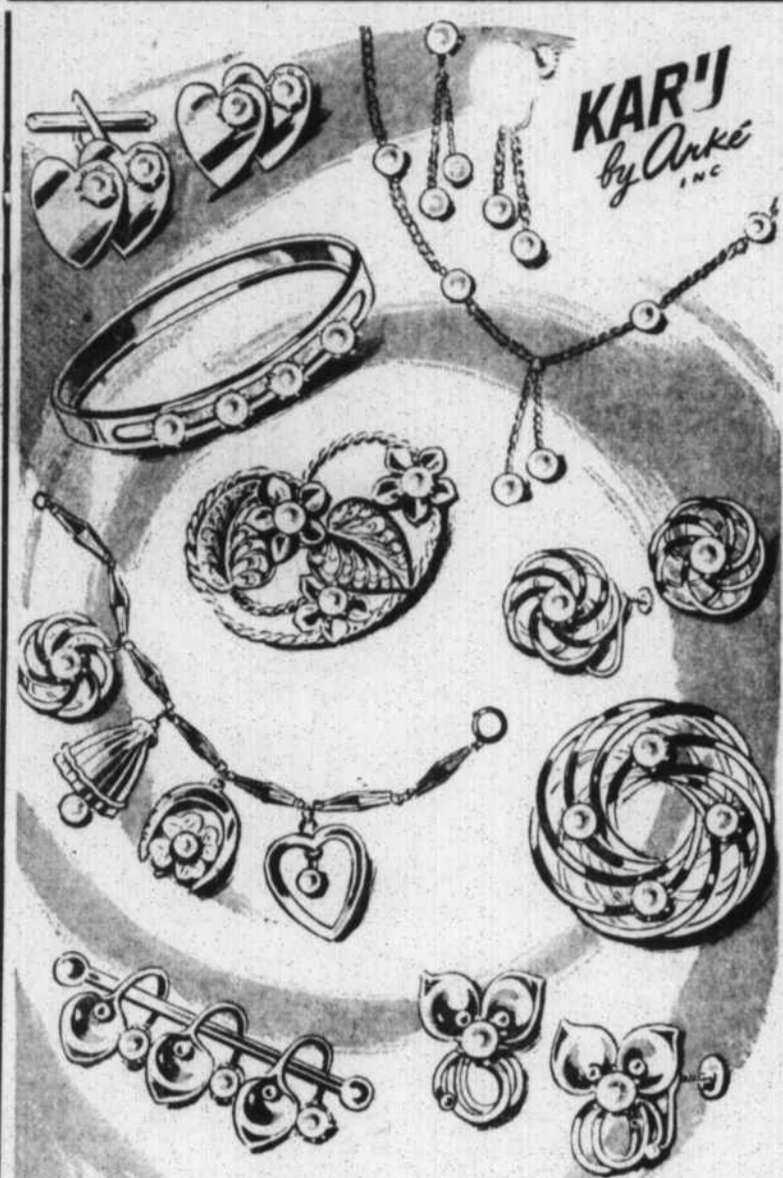
Miss Patsy Thompson was flower girl. Her dress was of mint green taffeta, and she carried a basket of rose petals.
