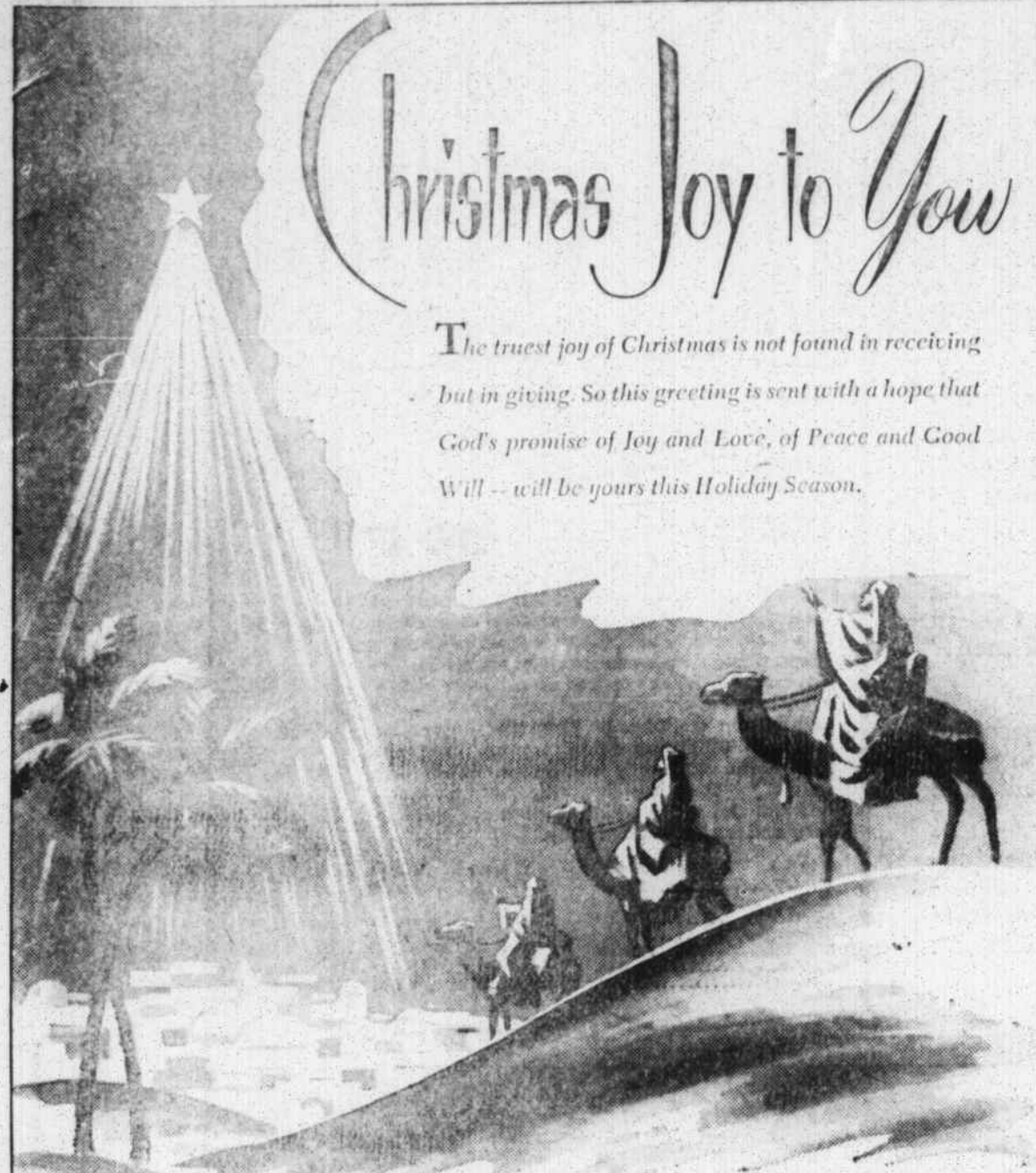
Archaeologists' Findings Support Bible Stories

Archaeologists' findings oftentimes serve to further establish the authenticity of the story of Jesus. Only recently a group discovered the name of Jesus, carved before 70 A.D. and perhaps by an eyewitness to the crucifixion, among inscriptions on 11 early Christian burial urns found in a cave on the Jerusalem-Bethlehem road. The urns may provide the "oldest archaeological record of Chris-

tianity" and an historical confirmation of the trial and crucifixion of Christ, the archaeologists said. A sect of Hebrews, who for Jesus, denounced Pontius Pilate and mourned the crucifixion, their leader, was believed to have left writings on the urns in a cave. The Hebrew and Aramic inscriptions contained common names: Miriam, Simeon, and Matti. Greek inscriptions and symbols beside them contained references to Christianity and, it seems probable, to the crucifixion. Formosa is less than 50 miles from the Chinese mainland.

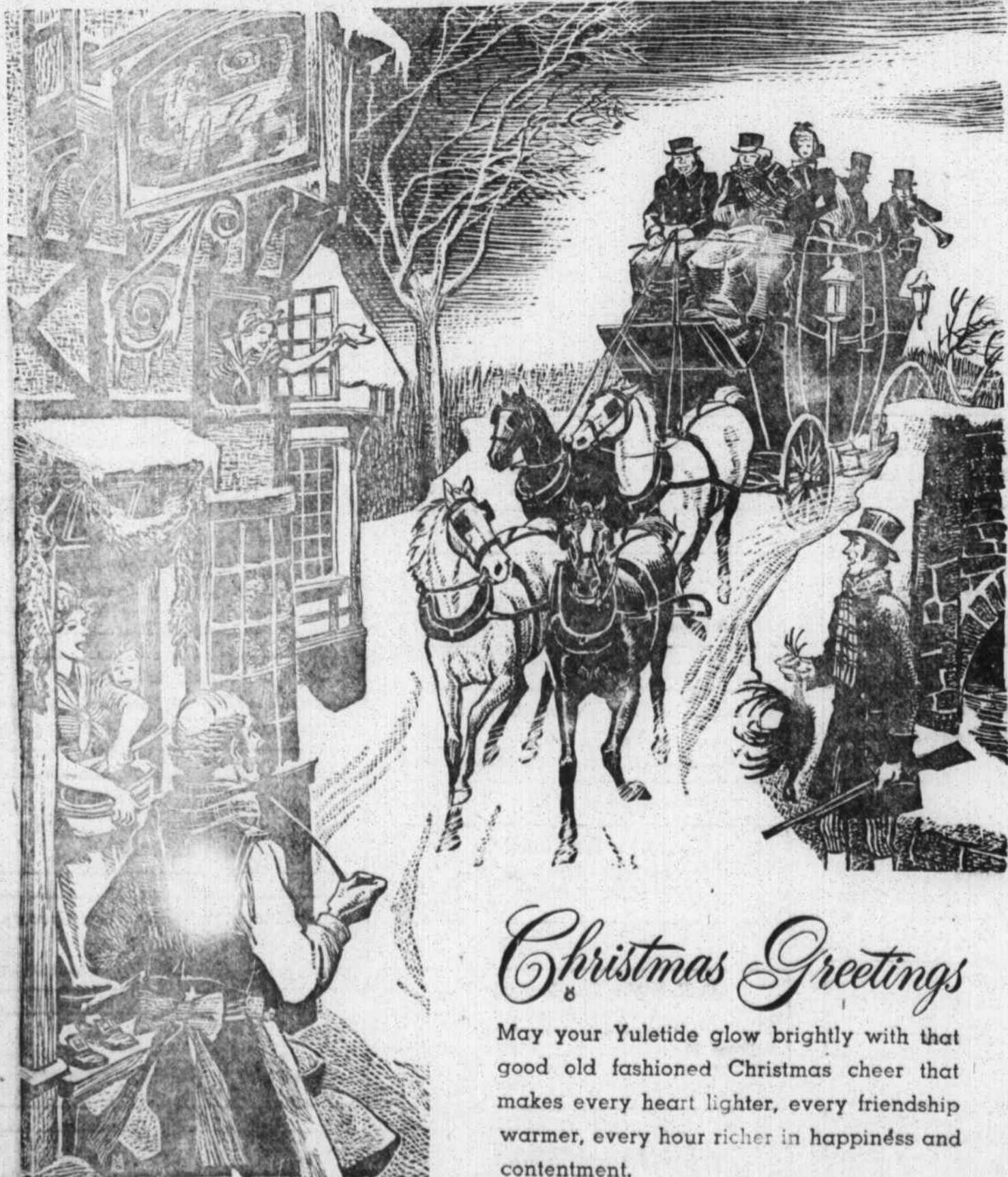
