The Cherokee Historical Association will work at the side of the Eastern Band of Cherokees in an effort to develop a program to replace Federal supervision of the Qualla Boundary reservation.

The association's board of trustees yesterday adopted a comprehensive program aimed at safeguarding Indian lands, health benefits, and educational facilities. The action was taken at the board's winter meeting here and came at a time when indications point to Government pursuit of a withdrawl program which in the main ignores Indian recommenda-

The board's program would keep Indian lands under tribal ownership, attempt to have some responsible non-profit organization take over Cherokee hospital, establish a consolidated, regional academic and vocational school, seek continued State maintenance of reservation roads, and ask the State to make available on the Indians its Extension Service aids.
