

tle against sound is a large room built on its own foundation, completely independent of the building that surrounds it. It has 12-inch concrete walls, especially hardened on the inside to keep sound in There is a giant paddle, 8 x 16

feet. Hamme explains that sound bounces around in different wave lengths. The paddle mixes it up to make it as equal as possible all over the room The staff will determine how

long it takes sound to die in the room when it is empty, then with varying objects in the room. It then can figure what objects or materials absorb it most readily. Hamme says there is a much

easier way of ridding the world of noise: "Just pull the switch. But the world won't buy that, of course.
