Asa succeeded his father, Abijah, to the throne of Judah. "And he took away the altars of the strange gods, and the high places, and brake down the images, and cut down the groves."
The Ethiopians, having a huge army, attacked the kingdom of Judah, but Asa the king appealed to the Lord, who smote the Ethiopian hosts, so that they fled, pursued by the army of Judah.
Azariah the prophet went to meet Asa, telling him that as long as he and his people were true to God, He would be with them; but if they forsook Him the Lord would forsake them.
King Asa gathered his people and the strangers in his realm. They came to Jerusalem for a great revival, vowing to seek the Lord with all their souls.
