## Asa's Religious Reforms

HE TAUGHT HIS PEOPLE TO TRUST IN GOD AND HELD A GREAT REVIVAL

Scripture—II Chronicles 14-16.

**NEWMAN CAMPBELL**  
 ARE shown in today's les-  
 son whose father was  
 and whose mother was an  
 Asa, and who was reared  
 unfavorable home atmos-  
 phere became an upright,  
 young man. Asa, son  
 of Azariah, was the third king to  
 rule the separated kingdom  
 of Judah.

Unusual, but occasionally  
 we see such a phenome-  
 non, brought up by peo-  
 ple whose morals are not of the  
 best, nevertheless, develops  
 into a person. Also the re-  
 sult has been—alas!—a son  
 who has been raised in a Chris-  
 tian home, but who has crim-  
 inal tendencies.

Asa did that was good  
 in the eyes of the Lord.  
 He took away the altars of  
 Baal, and the high  
 places, and brake down the im-  
 ages, and cut down the groves.  
 These were places set aside  
 for the worship of the idols of  
 other, Maachah.

Judah was a comparative-  
 small country, surrounded by  
 much larger and far more  
 powerful, so Asa began to build  
 up the kingdom and to train an army

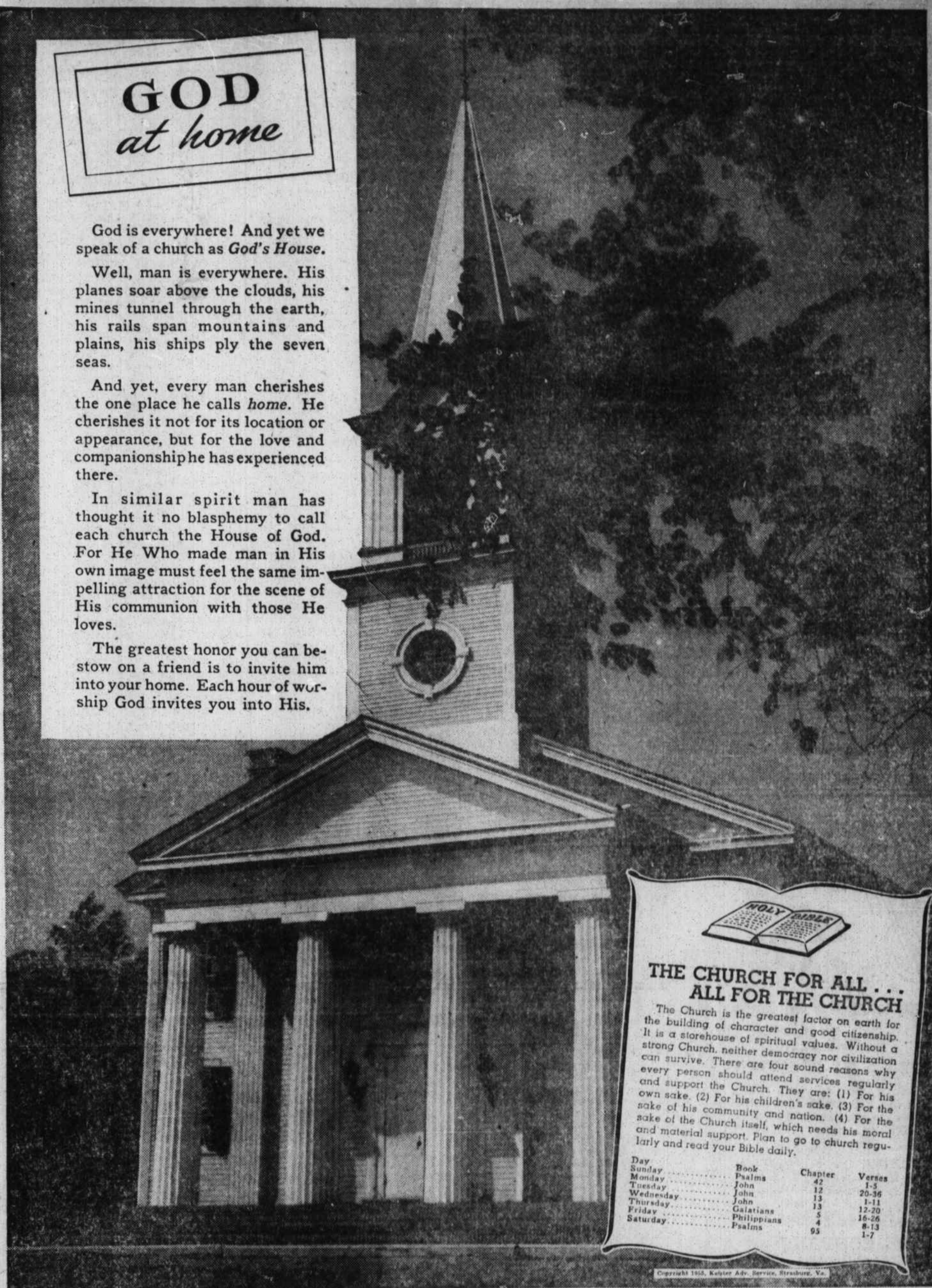
and his land in a time of  
 peace.  
 He built the cities and made  
 fortifications about them and towers,  
 and battlements. He raised an army  
 of mighty men of valor. Best of  
 all, he kept his trust in God to  
 save him and his people.

When the land was attacked  
 by the more powerful forces  
 of the Ethiopians—by the Ethiopians  
 from the southeast with many  
 thousands of men of arms and 300  
 chariots. The invaders encamped  
 in the town of Mareshah, a  
 short distance from the foot of the  
 mountain of Gaba.

When the battle lines were set  
 and Asa went out to meet his  
 enemies, he cried to the Lord his  
 God, "Lord it is nothing  
 to me to help, whether with  
 me or without me; but Thou art  
 with them that have no  
 help in Thee, O Lord our God;  
 stand up against this multi-  
 tude, Lord, Thou art our God;  
 and Thou shalt prevail against  
 them." And the Ethiopians  
 were smitten completely, with  
 Asa and his army pursuing.  
 We read that Asa "carried away  
 very much."

The Spirit of God came  
 upon Asa, and he produced  
 the following outlines produc-  
 ed by the Churches of C  
 Distributed by Kin

upon Azariah the son of Oded. He  
 went out to meet the king, and  
 said to him: "Hear me, Asa, and  
 all Judah and Benjamin; The  
 Lord is with you, while ye be with  
 Him; and if ye seek Him, He will  
 be found of you; but if ye for-  
 sake Him, He will forsake you."  
 Asa listened to the prophet.  
 "For a long season Israel hath  
 been without the true God, and  
 without a teaching priest, and  
 without law. But when they in  
 their trouble did turn unto the  
 Lord God of Israel, and sought  
 Him, He was found of them."  
 Asa then gathered all Judah  
 and Benjamin and the strangers  
 with them, and they gathered  
 themselves together at Jerusalem,  
 and held a great revival. They  
 offered sacrifices of all the spoil  
 they had taken from the de-  
 feated Ethiopians and "they en-  
 tered into a covenant to seek the  
 Lord God of their fathers with  
 all their heart and with all their  
 soul."  
 They went too far in their en-  
 thusiasm, threatening to put to  
 death any man or woman who  
 would not seek the Lord. They  
 celebrated "with shouting, and  
 with trumpets, and with cornets."  
 Asa said to say, the last years of
