Bible Words for Today

To help us understand the Christian philosophy of the place of physical evil, including sickness, in God's scheme of things, I commend for meditation the passage from St. John's Gospel in which Christ, the Divine Physician, paused in His work of healing to drive home the basic spiritual point concerning sickness:

"And Jesus passing by, saw a man, who was blind from his birth:

"And his disciples asked him: Rabbi, who had sinned, this man or his parents, that he should be born blind?"

Jesus answered: Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents; but that the works of God should be made manifest in him."

John 9, 1-3 (Douay)

That the works of God should be manifest in him! That the power of God should be revealed in him! That the glory in God might be served by him! These are the purposes of sickness.

But sickness also comes so that the mercy of God may be demonstrated, together with God's power and wisdom, in and through and by those who serve His sick, afflicted and tormented—as do devout nurses, instruments of the Almighty, healers of physical evil and teachers of spiritual truth!
