Traffic On Dual Highway Must Stop In Observance Of The School Bus Law

The Vehicles Department today that traffic on a dual, or separate, must come to a stop when approaching a school bus.

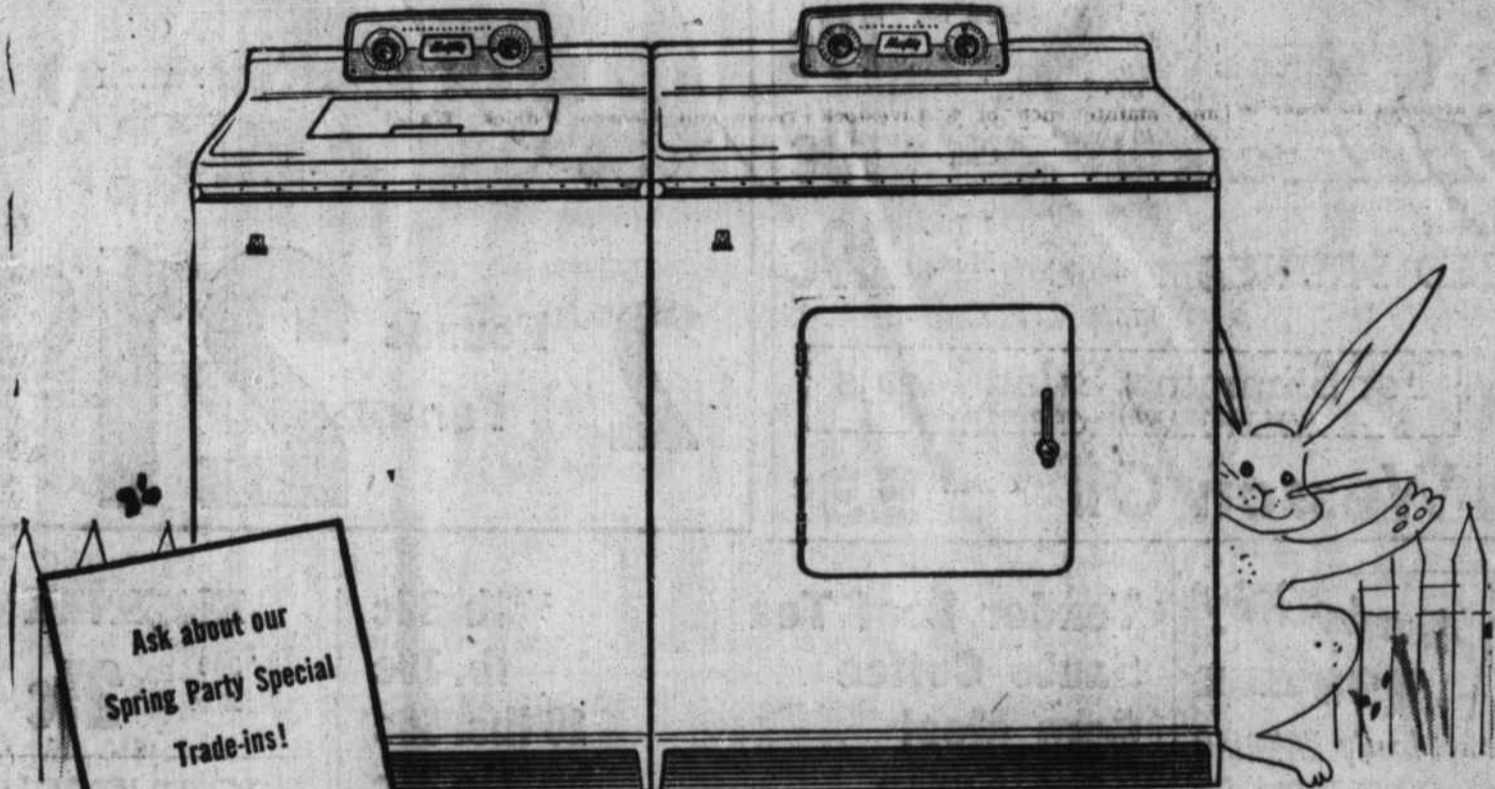
