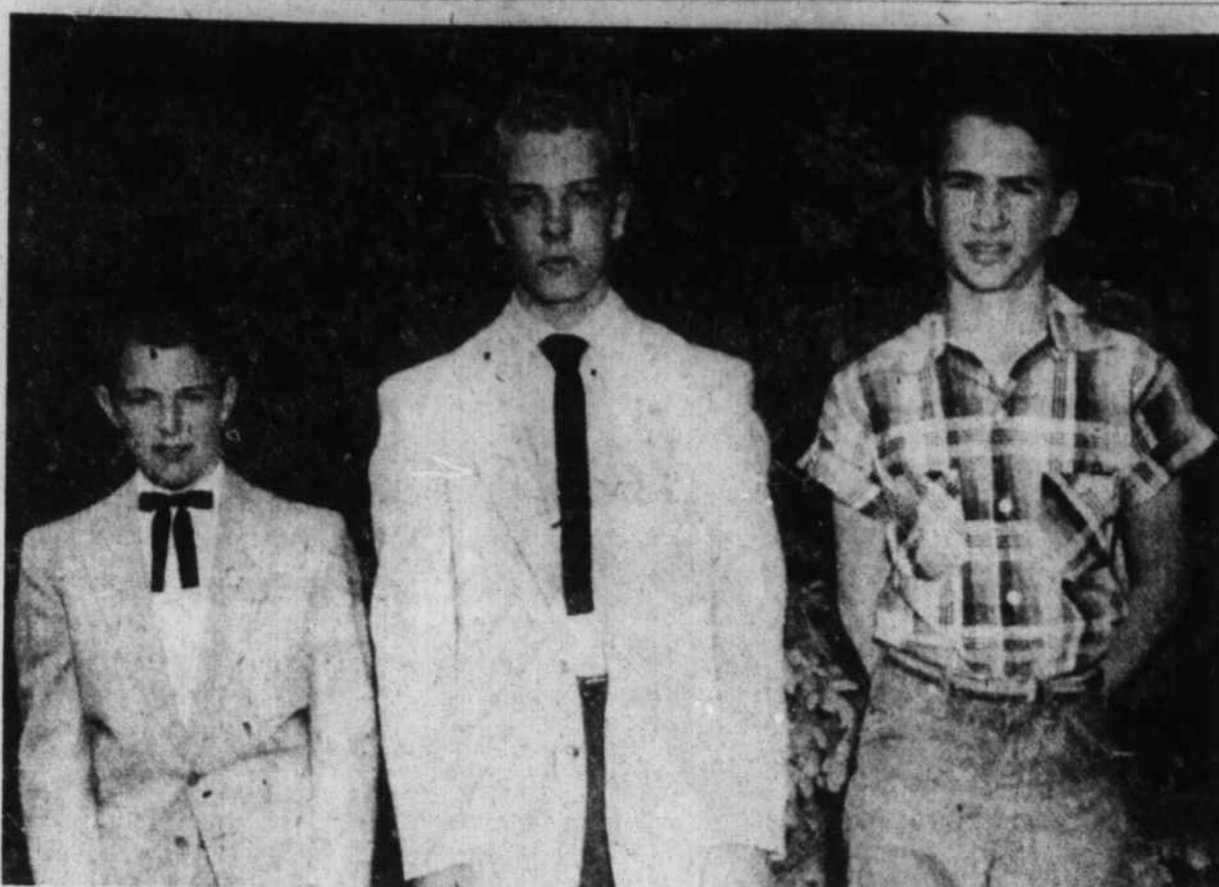

Dancing to Pete Lampley's orchestra will follow at 8:30 p.m. New officers of the Canton-Bethel-Clyde Chamber are:

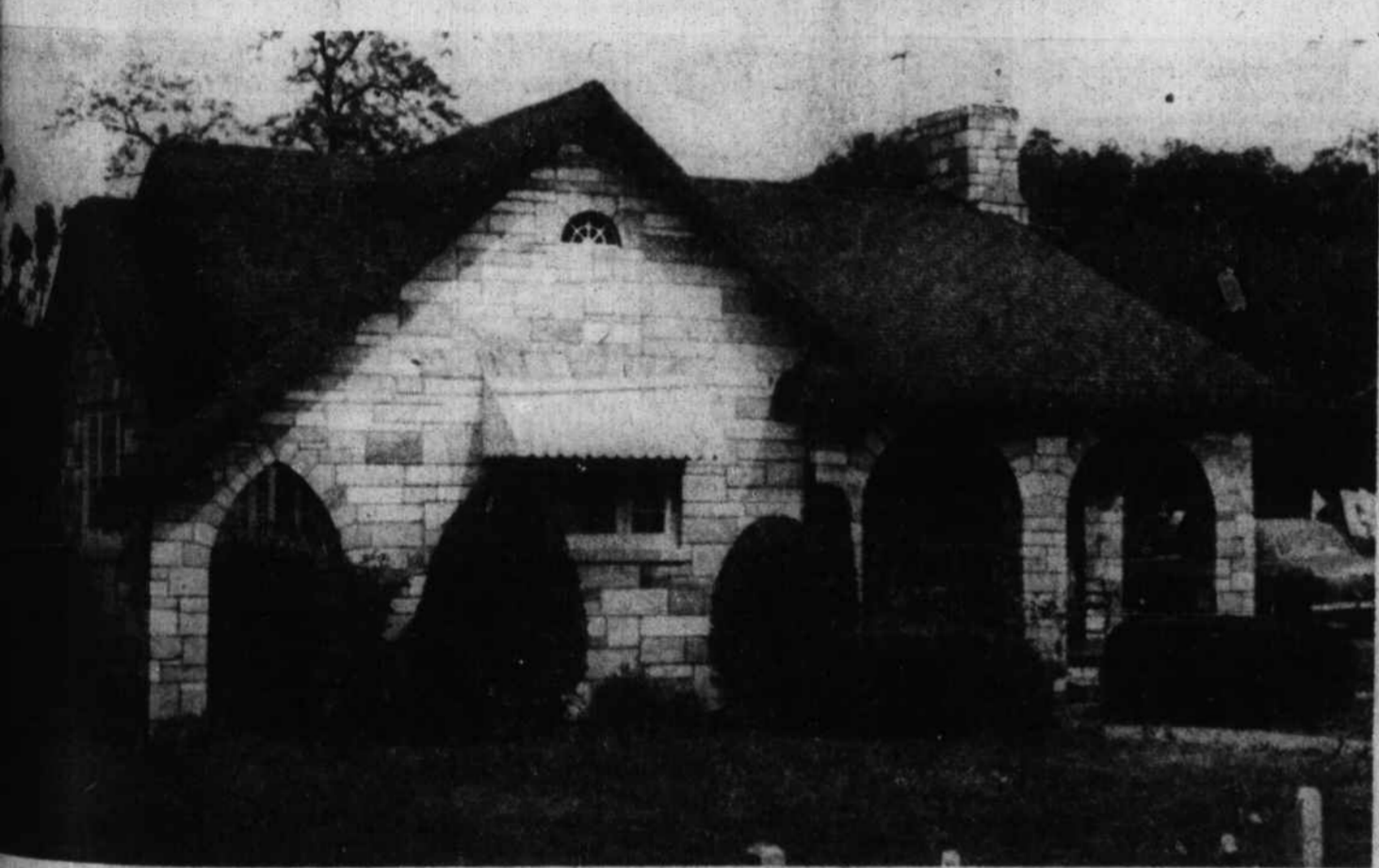
