pared for them." George Rawlinson also writes that "The singing Levites, like the other division of the body, were divided into 'courses' each of which took the temple service in turn."

It was the greatest Passover ever celebrated in Judah. "All the service was prepared the same day to keep the Passover, and to offer burnt offerings upon the altar of the Lord, according to the commandment of King Josiah. "And the children of Israel that were present kept the Passover at that time, and the feast of unleavened bread seven days." The Passover was kept in the 18th year of the reign of Josiah.
