### Conference For 1500 At Lake Set For 5 Days Next July

A change in dates for the quadrennial conference of the Methodist Church's Southeastern Jurisdiction, to be held at Lake Junaluska next summer was announced this week by the jurisdictional College of Bishops.

The conference will meet July 11-15 instead of opening on July 5, as previously planned.

"The change will enable us to avoid conflict with the July 4 holiday and the customary heavy tourist traffic in Western North Carolina, and assure more adequate accommodations for delegates and visitors," said Bishop Marvin A. Franklin, Jackson, Miss. He presided at a meeting of the episcopal college Monday at Lake Junaluska in the absence of the president, Bishop Paul N. Garber, Richmond, Va.

More than 1500 clerical and lay delegates, visitors, and executives of Methodist boards and agencies are expected to attend the sessions. The conference is convened every four years as the chief administrative and promotional body for the church's Southeastern Jurisdiction of nine states and Cuba. Bishop Costen J. Harrell, Charlotte, is program chairman.

The large attendance is expected to overtax hotels and lodges at Lake Junaluska, overflowing into Waynesville and nearby motels.

The Rev. J. W. Fowler, Jr., superintendent of the Lake Junaluska Assembly, said that a Central Committee will be in charge of all reservations for delegates and visitors to the conference. He emphasized that the committee will not start processing reservations until late fall, after the last annual conferences of the church meet and elect delegates.

Mr. Fowler said the conference dates were changed mainly to help owners of motels of the Waynesville area by having the visitors come after the July 4 rush of business.
