Junaluska Day Will Be Observed At Lake Sunday

"Junaluska Day," an annual highlight of the summer program at the Lake Junaluska Methodist

Assembly, will be observed Sunday morning in the main auditorium. At that time pledges and cash gifts will be directed to the building fund of the new \$80,000 Youth Center, which is rapidly nearing completion on the lakeshore near the swimming pool.

Bishop John Branscomb, Jacksonville, Fla., will preside at this portion of the morning service, present the Youth Center cause and receive the offering. The Rev. Lee F. Tuttle, Charlotte, is directing the South-wide fund campaign in behalf of the building.

"We have nearly \$50,000 in the fund and it would be wonderful if we could conclude the campaign Sunday," Dr. Tuttle said.

The Sunday program will be held in connection with the 11 a.m. services under the auspices of the Methodist Conference which opens tonight at the lake. The guest speaker will be Dr. Matt L. Ellis, president of Hendrix College, Conway, Ark.

The new Youth Center will be named in memory of the late Bishop Paul B. Kern. The building will measure 4,800 square feet. Features will include a central fellowship hall, class rooms, offices and recreational facilities.

Circuit judge J. B. Siler, Policeman James Turner, and Policeman M. E. Davis were suspicious of two youths out at an early hour, after receiving a call that the station had been robbed.

who otherwise would not have been financially able to go, are directly benefitting by the generosity of the many who contributed to the United Fund last fall.

"It is a wonderful way of giving, this grouping of all the communities' needs, and even though new here, it has proven a wonderful success. And that is why United Fund officials are looking to the future when the time will come for another drive this fall, with complete confidence."
