

Personals Cleaning Venetian Blinds Can Be A Simple Task

If you've been dreading the day [you'd have to clean the venetian are some cleaning tips which will help to lighten your chore.

According to Mamie Whianant, State College extension specialist in home management, the way you take care of your blinds from week to week and from day to day will have a lot to do with the kind of cleaning job you have to do. She adds, however that weekly dusting -even with special brushes or vacuum attachment-is not enough to keep venetian blinds clean forever. They must be washed occasionally to remove the oily film that adheres to the surface.

Wash each slat with a cloth or ponge using warm suds or one of the new "no-rinse" cleaners. Venetian blinds may be put into the bathtub where slats and tapes may ly and make your scrubbing job
