### Haywood Teachers List For New Season

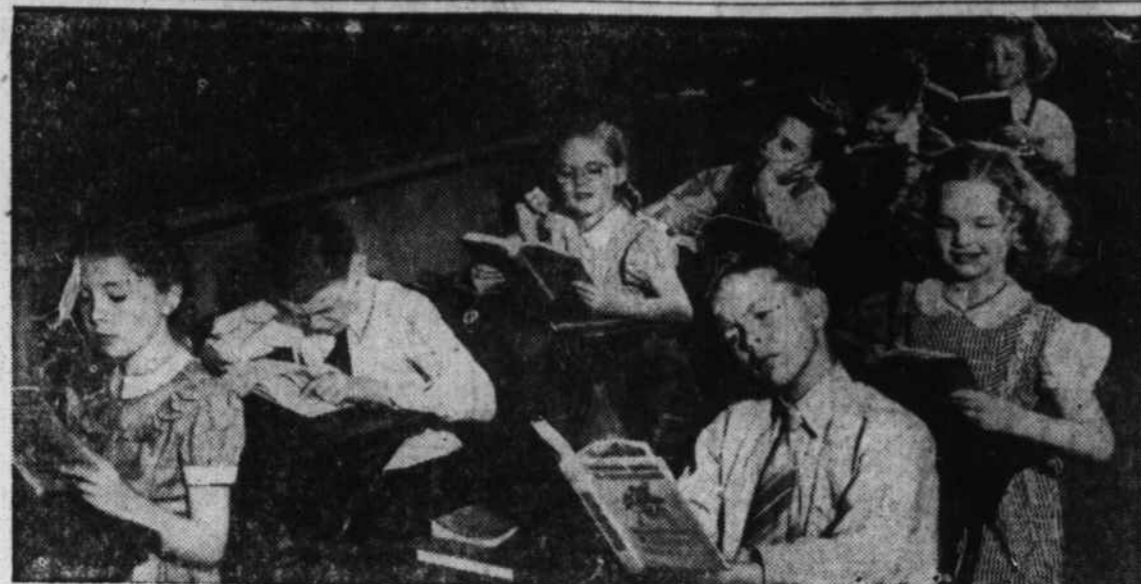
