## Coy, Four Under Par, Wins Local Title From McKenzie, 4 and 2

## Here's Advice On Growing Of Peonies

We have received a number of requests for information about peonies — will they grow here should they be divided, when should they be moved, when and how should new plantings be made?

Peonies are more easily grown in the Piedmont and mountain sections of North Carolina but they can also be grown in the Coastal Plain with a little better care. The time for making new plantings or for moving or dividing old plant would be October and November in eastern North Carolina and September and October for the western or mountain section of the state.

But don't move them unless there is some good reason to do so. Peonies do not like to be disturbed. If you have a clump that is doing well and producing good blooms, let it alone. Any loss of roots in digging will have a harmful effect. It is no necessary to divide and move peonies every two or three years as we do iris and daffodils.

If a plant is not blooming satisfactorily then it may be advisable to move it to a better location, or perhaps it has been planted too deep and should be taken up and

replanted. In such cases, cut off as few roots as possible. Peonies should be planted shallow. The buds should not be more than one or two inches below the surface of the soil.

The current magazines and newspapers are advertising the "miracle plant" which is guaranteed to bloom for you without soil or water. It will really do that. The plant is the colchicum which resembles a large lavender crocus and will send out blooms without leaves during August or September no matter if you put it in soil, water, or on the kitchen shelf. You can buy these bulbs at any of the large seed stores. They may be planted in the yard about two inches deep. Leaves are produced in the spring which die down in summer and flowers appear during August or September.

The hardy amaryllis and the so-called "spider lily," which is also an amaryllis, have a similar type of growth and blooming habit as the colchicum.

Experiments with deer show that even when plenty of food is available, they cut their consumption of food about half in winter and lose about 20 pounds in that season.
