Dr. Matthews urged parents to cheek their own homes in order to eradicate accident hazards. He suggested that stairways, walkways, and yards be cleared, and that medicine cabinets be checked. He stated that thought should be given to proper lighting, and that milk bottles should be placed in containers and not left carelessly on door steps.

"From the ages of 1 to 14 years accidents kill more children than all known childhood diseases," Dr. Matthews stated. He cited several accident case histories, and urged parents to use common sense to avoid accidents.

In closing Dr. Matthews said. The life you save may be that of your own child".
