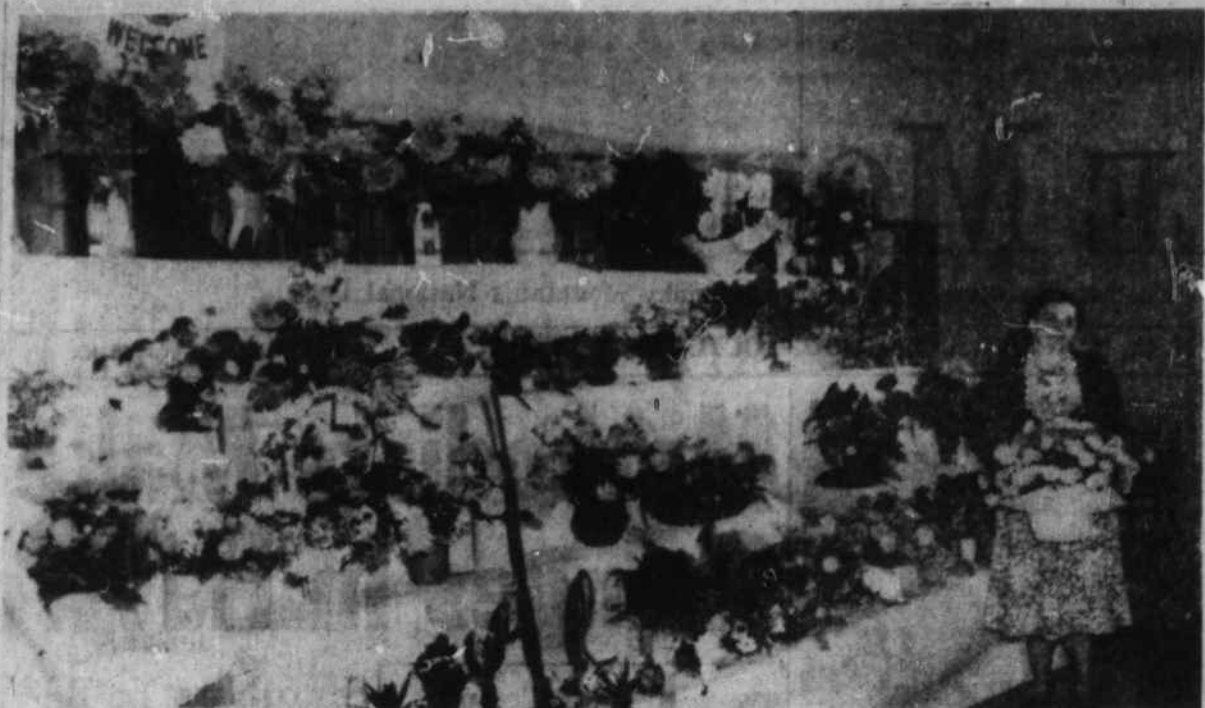
Dellwood Club Meets With Mrs. McCrary
