

WCC Ready For Annual Homecoming Day Saturday

Being completed this year is the annual Homecoming Day activities at Western Carolina College, according to an announcement by Robert C. Hall, secretary. The date is Saturday, October 15.

Homecoming Queen Mary Johnson, of Rt. 3, Candler, will preside over the day's activities, at her court composed of: William, Lake Junaluska; Williams, Rt. 2, Candler; Taggart, Asheville; Barbour, Whitler; Pat Spencer, Paula Cathryne McLeod.

The schedule of events is being completed, which will assemble at the new parking lot, and march the length of the street to the fountain in the courthouse.

Floats are being prepared by various student organizations on campus at WCC, and will be on hand to decorate the parade route.

The Homecoming Band, directed by Mr. J. H. Smith, will be featured in the parade and the half-time show at the football game.

Afternoon, open house will be held in the dormitories and at the Union Building, from 2 o'clock. At four, tea will be served in the faculty lounge, sponsored by Alpha Phi Omega, honorary scholastic organization of which Duane Oliver is president.

A general meeting of the Alumni Association will be held in the Gallery of Hunter Library, with Tom Mallonee of Candler presiding. Mallonee said that the largest crowd ever is expected to attend this meeting to hear reports of the first appeal for the alumni annual giving program, and to make plans for the coming year.

At 5:30 a barbecue will be served at the college picnic grounds for all visitors, and class reunions will be held at this time. This is the year for reunion of the following classes: 1893-'24; 1925; 1930; 1935; 1940; 1945; 1950; 1952; 1954. Each class will elect a representative to serve on the Alumni Council until the time of the next reunion.

Crowning of the Homecoming Queen and presentation of her court will occupy the time immediately preceding the football game. These ceremonies will be held at 7:45, and the Queen will present awards to the winning floats and campus houses.

At eight the football game between the Catamounts and the East Carolina Pirates is expected to draw an unusually large crowd, according to advance notice.

Homecoming festivities will end with a dance in the Gallery following the football game, sponsored by the Marshal's Club.
