## Struggle in the Wilderness

CHRIST IS TEMPTED BY SATAN, BUT RESISTS HIM

Scripture—Luke 4:1-15.

**TIMOTHY CAMPBELL** took Him up into a high mountain and showed Him all the kingdoms of the world spread out before Him.

Satan said: "All this power will I give Thee and the glory of them; for that is delivered unto me; and to whomsoever I will I give it. If Thou therefore wilt worship me, all shall be thine."

"And Jesus answered, and said unto him, Get thee behind Me, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and Him only shalt thou serve."

Matthew makes this the last temptation, but Luke writes: "And he brought Him to Jerusalem, and set Him on a pinnacle of the temple, and said unto Him, If Thou be the Son of God, cast Thyself down from hence: for it is written, He shall give His angels charge over Thee, to keep Thee: And in their hands they shall bear Thee up, lest at any time Thou dash Thy foot against a stone."

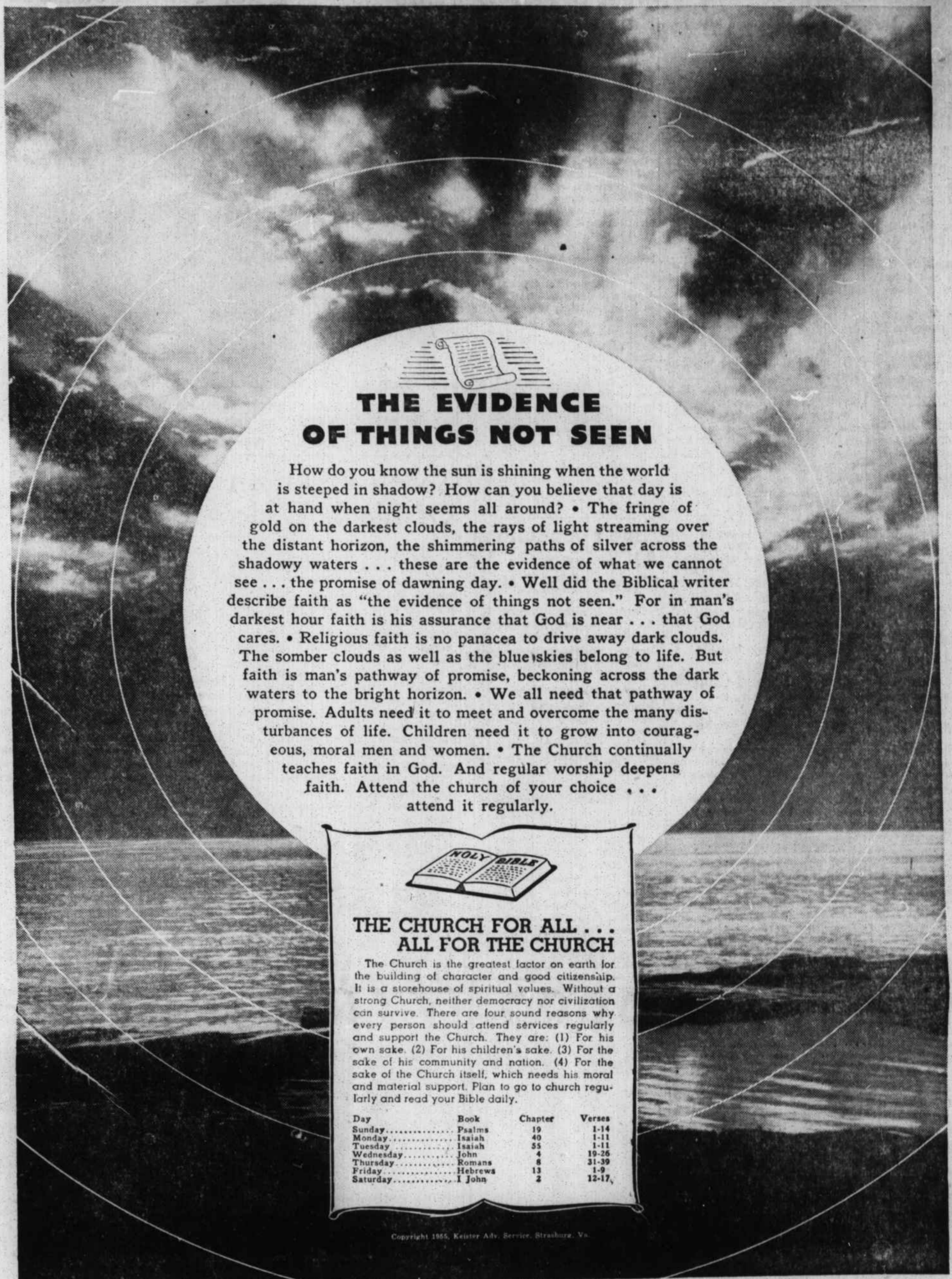
"And Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit into Galilee: and there went out a fame of Him through all the region round about. And He taught in their synagogues, being glorified of all."
