Jesus closed the book and gave it to the minister. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fastened upon Him, and they asked one another, "Is not this Joseph's Son?"

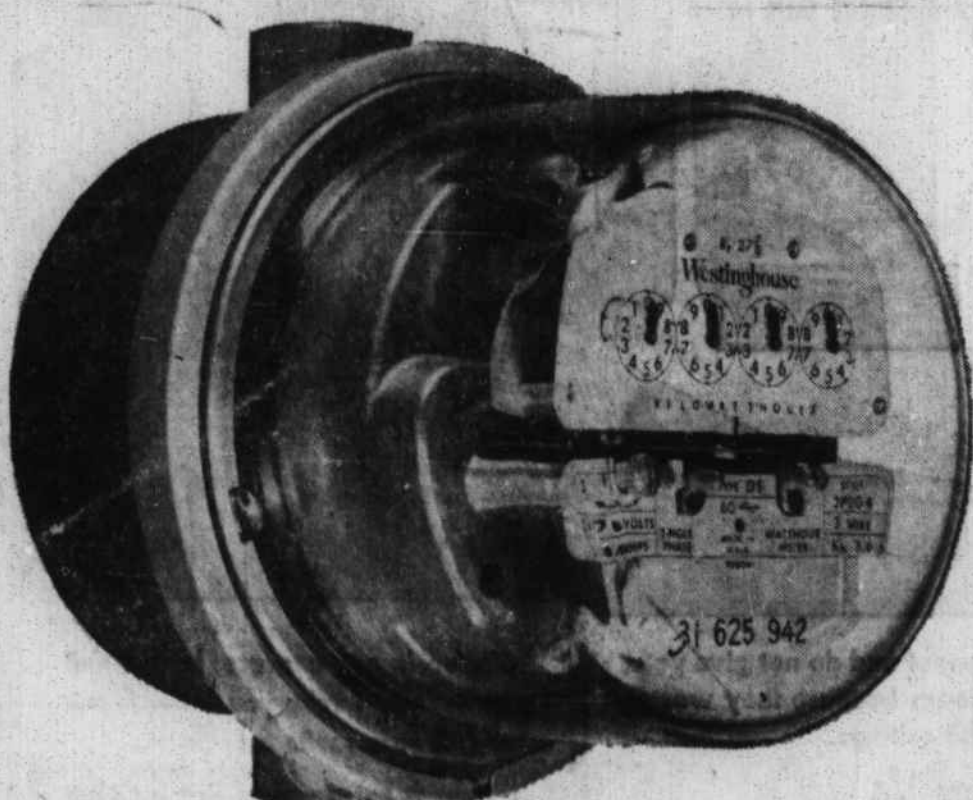

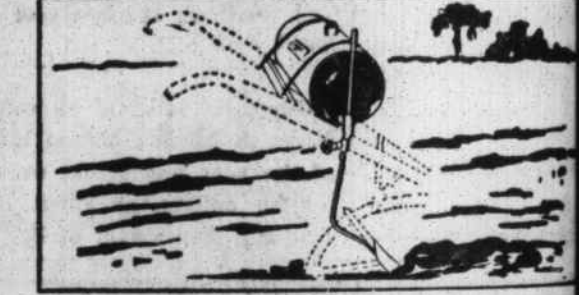

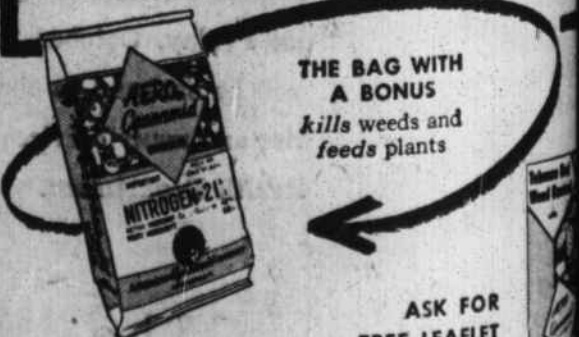
