Lunchrooms and school plants as a whole, however, are in good shape, he pointed out.

Another problem, the sanitarian commented, is garbage disposal, complicated by persons — mostly in the "fringe" areas — throwing rubbish over road banks and in fields.

This can be corrected, Mr. Milner said, by providing more adequate garbage disposal facilities-
