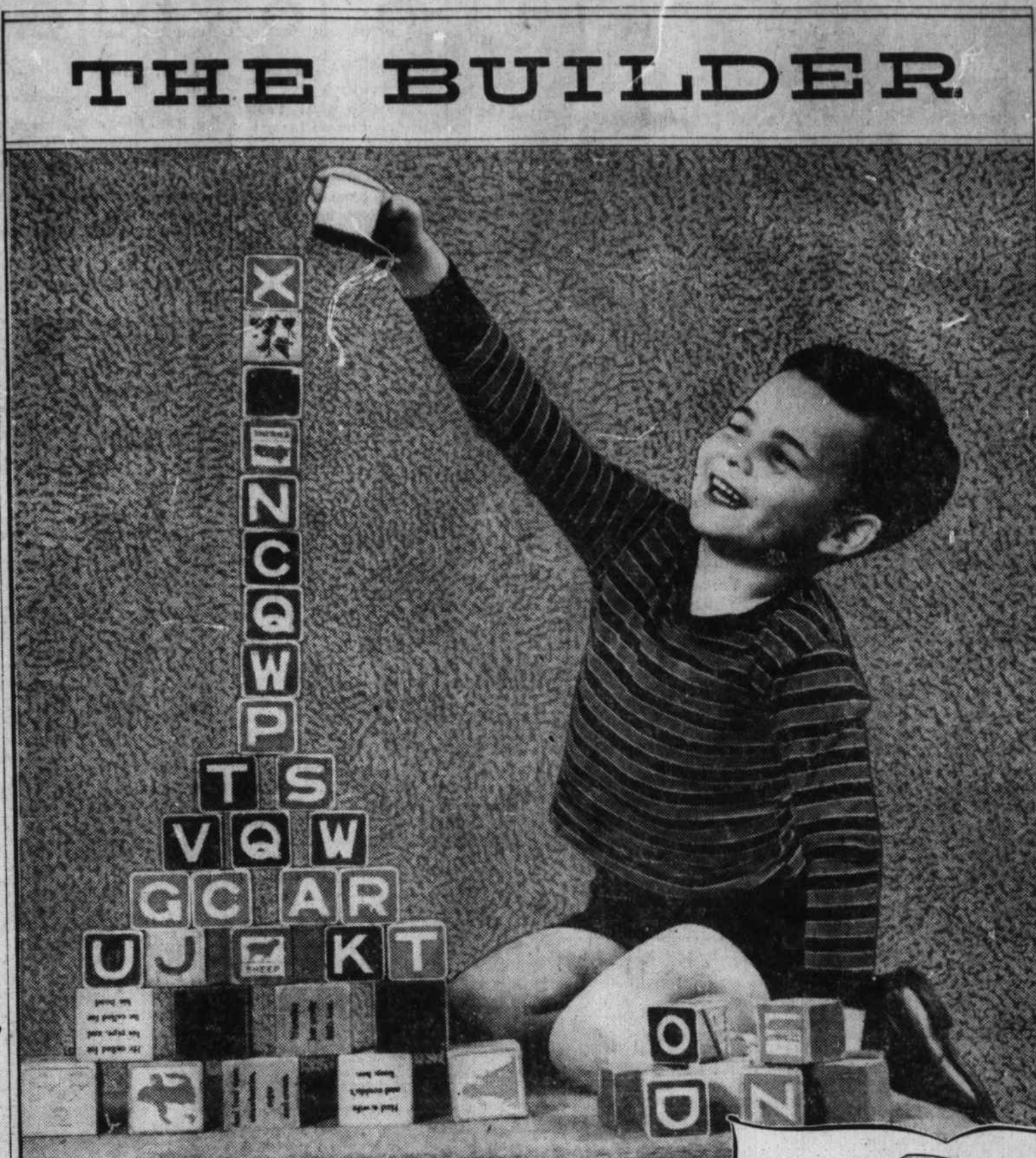

Jesus Meets Human Needs
HE PERFORMS MIRACLES OF HEALING

Scripture—Luke 5:1-6:16.

ONE of the incidents in the portion of the New Testament assigned to the first and second lessons of the first lesson is for the most part the story of Jesus' ministry at the Sea of Galilee.

Jesus had spread tremen-
dous news wherever He went
and He had some to re-
gret, others to listen to
people pressed upon
Him on the seashore,
and two ships by the
fishermen in them. He
had no ship, and asked
for a fisherman, if he
would take a little fur-
ther out. Peter (or Simon)
Christ preached to the
people from the boat.

Others had gone Jesus
to take the ship out
and drop the nets. He
said to Simon that they
ought with no results,
as he was told and the
net broke, and the
fishermen on shore were
weeping.

Jesus was so overcome
with the miracle, that He threw
down His net, and admit-
ted that He was a sinner.

MEMORY VERSE
That are whole need not a physician; but they that are
sick need to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance."
— Luke 5: 31, 32.

Jesus was a sinful man.
John, the sons of Zeb-
edee, his partners, were also
sinners. This occurrence, so
often brought their ships
to land, followed the Lord.

Jesus was in "a certain
city" when a leper came to Him,
saying, "If Thou wilt, Thou
canst cleanse me."
The disease not only
suffering, but ex-
posed him from any con-
tact. Lepers were
shut out, "Unclean, un-
clean," anyone approached
was a dreadful, lonely,
and these poor creatures
were touch a person so
that Jesus—the Fearless
forth His hand, and
saying, "I will, be
clean," and immediately the
leper was healed.

If the teacher has time, the epi-
sode of the walk through the field
on the Sabbath can be mentioned,
and the miracle of the man with
the withered hand who was healed
in the synagogue on the Sabbath
—further infuriating the Phari-
sees.

In Luke 6:13-16, the writer tells
of Jesus calling His disciples to-
gether and appointing the Twelve
Apostles to carry on His work.
