

Fulbright was the granddaughter of Peter Eisenhower, who was also the President's great-great grand-

Peter Eisenhower was born in Cove, Pa. 1716. His father, Haps Nicholas Eisenhower, born in 1691, was the founder of the Elsenhower family in America. He left Europe in 1741 aboard the ship Europa, and landed in Philadelphia, Pa.

They have just completed an ancestral chart containing approximately 2,000 names. They have also compiled a large scrapbook of letters from practically every state in the union and several foreign countries.

Mr. Medford's Great-Grandmothto Barnett Fulbright in 1812, Barnett's father Jacob and his brother John Fulbright settled in what is now Haywood County in 1785. The cove in which they lived was called Fulbright Cove. Later it became known as Dutch Cove because of the great number of settlers who came down from Dutch

Among other Haywood County descendents of Marey Eisenhower and Barnett Fulbright are the families of the late Nick Medford and wife, Sara Fulbright Medford, the late Wesley Valentine Robin son and wife, Martha Anne Fulbright Robinson, and the late Fulbright Jones,

The first of the Fulbright family to come to America was John Willhelm Volprecht. He sailed from Rotterdam aboard the ship Robert and Alice, and landed in Philadelphia, Pa. When he was naturalized at Northampton, Pa. In 1762 he changed the spelling of his name to John William Fulbright.


