

# UNC School Of Nursing Gets Special Recognition

CHAPEL HILL—The University of North Carolina School of Nursing has been approved for full accreditation by the Accrediting Services of the National League for Nursing. This is the first school of nursing in North Carolina to be accredited by this organization, which is the highest board of nursing in the U. S.

The approval of the four year undergraduate program leading to a B. S. degree in nursing includes the preparation of students for beginning Public Health Nursing positions.

This honor is given a school of nursing on the basis of an evaluation by the Accrediting Service on standards set by the league. A committee of nine nurses from

various parts of the country visited the UNC School of Nursing for a week last March in order to inspect the entire program.

A school cannot be accredited until its first class has graduated. The UNC school's first graduation was this past June.

School of Nursing Dean Elizabeth L. Kemble and three faculty members went to New York for the meeting of the league at which the accreditation was approved.

The school was among fifteen in the state that received temporary accreditation for a five-year period ending in 1957.

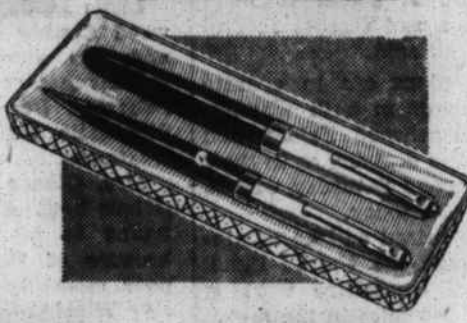

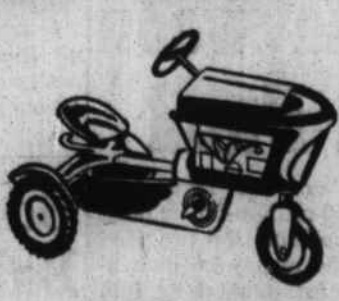
