### WNC Students Dominated State Land - Judging Meet

Western North Carolina farm youths dominated the second annual state Future Farmers of America land judging meet in Randolph County recently to win both first and second team and individual awards.

The Mills Rover chapter of Henderson County copped first place and a trip to Oklahoma, where it will represent North Carolina in the National FFA land judging meet for the second year in a row.

Mills Rover scored 550 points out of a possible 720. It was hard pressed by Stony Point of Alexander County with 541 points and second place. To the Stony Point team went a plaque and \$100 for expenses to the state FFA camp.

Mills River, which placed eight in last year's national meet, received a \$750 check to defray its expenses to this year's meet at Oklahoma City May 3-4, and a plaque for its chapter. Prizes were presented in the Farmer High

School auditorium by representatives of the N. C. Bankers Association and Carolina Power & Light Company, co-sponsors of the event. The land judging program is supervised by the N. C. Department of Vocational Agriculture Education, Agriculture Extension Service and Association of Soil Conservation District Supervisors and the U. S. Soil Conservation Service.

Fifty of 52 FFA federations were represented by teams of four at the meet. These teams were selected at federation elimination meets earlier.

The boys, who judge four different fields of varying nature, determine the potentials and quality of both top soils and sub soils, degree of erosion, slope and drainage.
