#### OLD-FASHIONED YEAST BREAD

Oatmeal yeast bread is a family favorite that dates back to grandmother's day. With this prize oatmeal bread recipe, you can make home-made bread and hot rolls with old-fashioned flavor reminiscent of her best.

**Oatmeal Yeast Bread**  
1/2 cup brown sugar  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1/4 cup shortening  
1 cup scalded milk  
1 cup boiling water  
3 cups oats, uncooked  
1/2 cup lukewarm water  
2 packages yeast  
3 1/2 to 4 cups sifted flour

Add sugar, salt and shortening to scalded milk. Pour milk and boiling water over rolled oats; combine well. Let stand until lukewarm. Dissolve yeast in lukewarm water, add to oats mixture; beat well and stir in flour. (Mixture will be rough in appearance.) Turn out on floured board and knead for five minutes, using more flour if necessary. Dough should be smooth and easy to handle. Grease top of dough and cover. Let rise in warm place until double in bulk, about 45 minutes. Punch dough down and divide in half. Cover, and let dough rest for ten minutes. Form into two loaves and place in well-greased bread pans (pound size). Grease top of each loaf. Let rise until nearly double in bulk. Bake at 375° F. for about 40 minutes. Remove at once from pans and place on wire rack to cool.

#### WITH THE ELECTRIC MIXER

You can get along without a mixer, but why? Why, when it simplifies the whole business of cooking and food preparation. You can whiz through cakes, icings, potatoes—just anything that needs a good beating with an efficient electric mixer. Always keep your electric mixer right out on your work counter so that it's always at hand when you want to beat up something good to eat.

Try these mixer-tested recipes for mighty good eating.

**Fluffy Banana Cake**  
2 large or 3 small bananas  
2 C. sifted all-purpose flour  
1/2 tsp. baking powder  
1/4 tsp. soda  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1/2 C. shortening, soft  
1 1/2 C. sugar  
2 eggs, unbeaten  
1 tsp. vanilla  
1/4 C. buttermilk

Place bananas in small mixer bowl and beat on low speed until mashed. Measure out 1 cup. Place shortening, sugar, eggs and vanilla in large mixer bowl and beat on high speed for 1 1/2 minutes. Scrape bowl while mixing. Add buttermilk. Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with mashed banana while beating on low speed. Beat only enough to blend—about two minutes. Pour into two greased and floured 9-inch cake pans. Bake in 350° F. oven for 30 to 35 minutes. Remove from pans. Cool. Fill and top with whipped cream.

**Meringue Shell**  
4 egg whites  
1/4 tsp. cream of tartar  
1 C. sugar

Beat egg whites until frothy, at high speed. Add cream of tartar. Beat until egg whites are stiff enough to hold a point. Beat in sugar gradually at medium high speed. Continue beating until meringue is stiff and glossy. Spread in well-greased and floured 8-inch pie pan lined with two thicknesses of brown paper. Bake 20 minutes in a slow oven 275° F. Then increase temperature to 300° F. and continue baking 40 minutes more. Remove from pan immediately to prevent sticking. Fill with fresh fruit or ice cream. (Makes 6 servings.)
