The Church Endures Persecution

ILLUSTRATED SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

Scripture—Acts 6:1-8:3.



The Greeks in the Christian church complained that their widows were not being given their fair share of the community possessions. The 12 apostles appointed seven men to adjust the matter in fairness to all.

Stephen was one of the men appointed. He was "full of faith and power," and "did great wonders and miracles among the people." This angered certain members of the synagogue, and they argued with him.

Not able to resist Stephen's wisdom and spirit, they then incited certain evil men to stir up the people, the elders and scribes. They caught him, accusing him of blasphemy against the temple and the law.

Asked if he was guilty, Stephen answered that they had betrayed and murdered Christ, sent to them by God. Infuriated they cast him out of the city and stoned him.

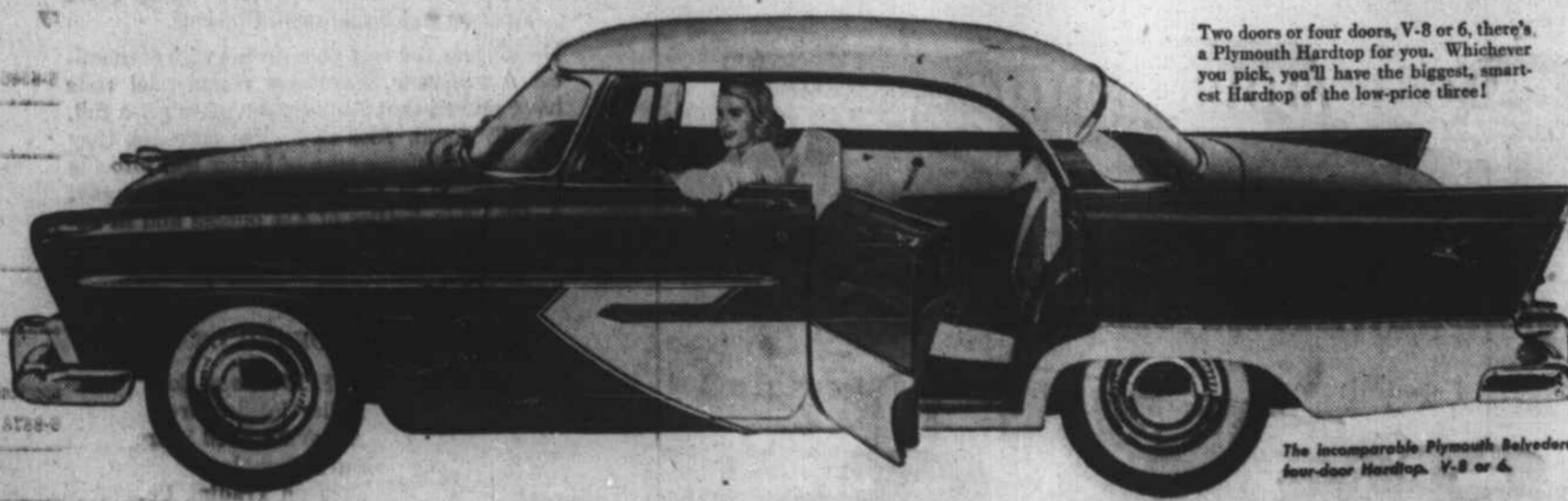
