Mrs. Cagle received the tri-color award for the best horticulture specimen, a gloxinia, which was also judged the best exhibit in the show. She received, in addition to the tri-color, a silver bowl presented through the courtesy of Gans Jewelers. Mrs. Cagle's entries in various classes won 19 blue ribbons, 5 red ribbons, and 4 yellow ribbons.
