

# Highlanders Promotional Plan Now In Full Swing

A large scale Western North Carolina tourist promotional plan is now being carried out in 58 large cities in the Eastern United States.

At the annual meeting of the Western North Carolina Highlanders in Asheville, Friday, October 26, John Parris, President of the group and general chairman for the Promotional Plan, gave a full report on activities to date.

Parris said 22 soap jingle contests have been completed with a vacation trip to Western North Carolina for two (as the first prize) in Mississippi, Tennessee, Arkansas, Connecticut, North Carolina, Alabama, Virginia, Georgia and Michigan cities.

There will be a total of 100 contests. They are being sponsored by the Colgate Palmolive Company and the following Western North Carolina Counties: Avery, Buncombe, Cherokee, Graham, Haywood, Henderson, Jackson, Madison, Macon, Mitchell, Swain, Transylvania, Watauga and Yancey. The following attractions are also joining in the promotion: Chimney Rock, Flat Rock Playhouse, Unto These Hills, Horn in the West, Grandfather Mountain, Blowing Rock, Whiteside Mountain, Biltmore House.

A new regional folder has been published and over 300,000 have been distributed in conjunction with the contests. Two winners have already come to the area for vacations. Others will be arriving shortly. Hotels, motels and guest homes will provide rooms and restaurants will furnish meals.

John Parris said: "I think this is the finest example of area cooperation that has been displayed in Western North Carolina. And with the tremendous potential promised from the 100 Free Vacation Promotions, the area is off on the right foot."

WASHINGTON—Nancy Kefauver, a talented artist, has at last done one of her husband. Reluctantly, she painted the Democratic vice presidential nominee from photographs, not from life as she has long wanted to do.

"He never sits still long enough," the attractive red-haired Nancy told me at a party at her Spring Valley home. "A friend in New York wanted one right away for his office, so I worked it out from a composite drawing I made from several photographs."

A portrait Nancy did of their 10-year-old son, David, dominates the study. A painting of daughter Linda and her dolls in 1949 won top honors at a local exhibit. It hangs over the mantel in the living room.

"I haven't had time for portraits lately," Nancy told friends and neighbors gathered for the party.

The four children, David, Linda, Diane, and Gail and their varied interests have kept her busy. Because of them she decided against accompanying her husband on his campaigns this year, as she did in 1952.
