Clyde Man Cited For Fine Work With Seabees On Big Project At Cape Hatteras

BUXTON ON CAPE HATTERAS —After formally commending First Class Steelworker David Smith Rogers for "outstanding personal contribution" to the construction of the U.S. Navy's multi-million-dollar secret facility here the commanding officer of the Navy's Seventh Battalion Seabees went one unusual step further and added "you are hereby recommended for advancement in the rating of Chief Petty Officer."

Commendation of the lanky mountaineer, a veteran of 15 years active or reserve service in the Navy occurred at a special muster of the Seabee's 200-man detachment and the citation was read by Lieut. Blake W. VanLeer, Jr., who commands the outfit which will begin moving out of here this week three months ahead of its estimated working schedule. VanLeer is the son of the former dean of the School of Engineering at State College who was president of Georgia Tech at the time of his death earlier this year.

Since the arrival of the Seabees on this remote island off the mainland of North Carolina 18 months ago they have erected an

establishment that covers a site of about 25 acres just north of the storied tallest lighthouse in the world. Two massive buildings house the ultra secret electronic equipment and adjacent to them are living quarters, utilities, an auditorium, stores and recreation buildings. All structures are of solid block construction, reinforced with steel to withstand the rigors of occasional hurricanes that hit Cape Hatteras.

Two battalions of the Seabees have been on duty here, the Sixth arriving in May, 1955. The Sixth was replaced by the Seventh early this year but Rogers was transferred to the latter battalion when need of his experience became evident and he returned to Cape Hatteras. He has had the immediate supervision of a crew of about 40 men in the erection of the steelwork.

At the same time the official citation was awarded the Haywood county man he was also in receipt of a letter of thanks and commendation from James C. Westcott, liaison engineer for the Western Electric Co., who has had charge of the installation of the specially designed and built elec-

As a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, I shall continue to insist that the Administration be bluntly frank with the Congress and the American people as to what our needs are based on the absolute fact that we are constantly being threatened by the forces of Communism. The President should take the matter in hand and present some sort of blueprint for us to consider.

During the last Congress I stated on a number of occasions that the Administration had jeopardized our national security by unwarranted defense cuts. Service on the Air Inquiry Subcommittee convinced me that there was a lack of coordination and planning in several areas vital to national defense and that there was strong evidence that a calculated risk was

being taken.

Time Is Urgent

I do not wish to be an alarmist. I do wish to be a realist. It is a most critical and grave situation in which we find ourselves today. I have my share of faith in diplomacy—and I hope and pray that world statesmen will labor until peace on earth is guaranteed to every human being—but candor compels me to conclude that our powder must be dry, ready for any emergency. Time is urgent for adequate defense readiness. From my talks with the people of North Carolina, I am more than ever convinced that they wish our nation to be adequately prepared.

It is to be hoped that the Administration will lay before the Congress at the earliest moment a long overdue and desperately needed plan for a fully coordinated and realistic defense program.

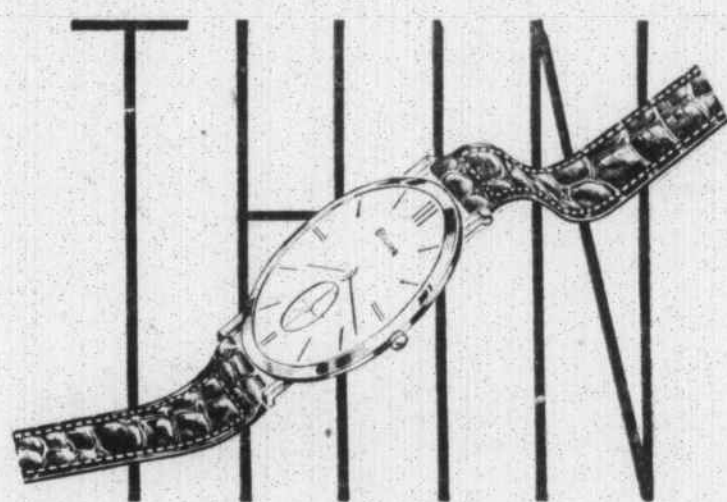
