Fires Are Hazard To Country Homes

Cold weather brings an increase

in fire hazard to country homes, says David S. Weaver, head of the agricultural engineering department at Raleigh College.

This is the season to begin the construction of chimneys, flues, and other parts of the heating systems, he maintained.

Another source of danger is that of allowing inflammable material to collect around stoves, fireplaces, chimneys, or flues where a careless dropped match or a spark may ignite it.

The use of soft brick and poor mortar is an attempt to build chimneys inexpensively is responsible for many a defect that has cost a farm family its home, Weaver added.

No beams or other things should be attached to a chimney for support, he continued, as any weight on a chimney is liable to pull it out of line and cause it to

collapse. These and chimney defects are checked frequently and particularly at the beginning of the cold weather period when fires are kept burning to warm the homes. Weaver urged that all farm families check over their heating systems to make sure there are no defects that may lead to a serious fire.

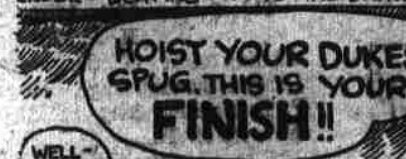
