Fatal Accident

H. A. Jarnan, 47, of Richlands, died in a hospital in Winston Tuesday from injuries received in an automobile accident near Ayden Monday night. Lynn Whaley died in an ambulance on the way to the hospital.

The men were killed when the driver of their speeding automobile lost control of the car on a curve and it left the road, overturning several times. Six men who were in the automobile with them are in a hospital in Kinross suffering from injuries which might prove fatal to some. They are: Boyd Whaley, Oakley Whaley, Charles House, Hugh Sandlin, Jack Shaver, and Raymond Williams.

All of the occupants of the car were thrown from it before it came to a head-on collision with a truck. Williams was found 40 yards from the wreckage when an ambulance returned to the scene after learning that one occupant was missing.
