Social Security Cards Nil as Identification

Officials of the Social Security Board today issued a warning to banks, stores, and other business concerns who have occasion to cash checks for the public, regerd-ing the acceptance of social security cards as personal identifica-tion. It has been learned that in various cities, throughout the country, blank checks which were stolen from business houses have been filled out and cashed, on the strength of a social security card as identification. One thief was
