Small grain crops in Eastern North Carolina are being damaged by a type of aphid known as the "Green Bug" State College an-

According to State College, there is no practical method of controlling the green bug. Luckily the aphids are not attacking all the crops, but the damage may become more widespread in the spring.

**Don't Sell All Your Sows Now**  
"Don't sell off all your sows and plan to go out of the hog

business but keep your hog program in line with supply of feed on the farm and follow good management practices," is the advice from N. C. State College. They suggest culling out poor sows, the use of additional grazing crops to offset high feed costs.

Men in the services eat about 1 1-2 times as much as they did when at home, so, all of these demands for our men in the armed forces, plus meat for Lend-Lease and freed peoples will call for a large number of hogs, all that can be produced from the available feed.
