HOUSEWIVES CAN AID CEILING DRIVE

Housewives are urged to cooperate with their grocers in a campaign to more prominently display ceiling prices in stores and to stimulate the use of price lists by consumers. The OPA in cooperation with leading grocers and consumer organizations is seeking to have shoppers talk more freely and frankly about ceiling prices as a means of strengthening efforts to hold down living costs.

LAKE HERRING PRICES ARE SUSPENDED

Retail ceiling prices on lake herring have been suspended, OPA announces. Should prices rise above 1942 levels ceilings will be promptly reset.

SHOE RATIONING STILL NEEDED

Present inventories and the present rate of production of shoes show the necessity for continued shoe rationing, the OPA and WPB reports.

DECEMBER 1 GIFT MAIL DEADLINE

December 1 is the deadline requested by the Post Office Department for mailing Christmas gifts inside the United States. Every citizen who is playing Santa Claus for loved ones and friends in other towns is urged to get that present in the mails to assure proper delivery. Americans are expected to mail 25 percent more gifts than a year ago, and at a time when the Post Office has fewer employees and less well-trained holiday help than ever before. In addition, the fact that more people have moved to different addresses to do war work is expected to mean that the average distance traveled by each gift will be greater than before the war.

CHRISTMAS STREET LIGHTING BAN

The Office of War Utilities of WPB is asking city officials, and all clubs, citizens to dispense with outdoor lighting this Christmas, so as to reduce electricity consumption and coal requirements. The fuel situation is still critical and strict conservation is required to keep war plants going full blast and homes properly heated.

SOUTHERN FARM MARKET SUMMARY

Spot cotton prices declined this week and spot sales increased over the preceding week. There was a good demand for Strict Low Middling and higher cotton in the Medium staples. Dog's Exercise

Regular Walks Will Keep Him And Owner In Shape

Coordinate your own exercise with that of your dog and you'll both be the better for it, advises the Gaines Dog Research Center, New York City. The dog's health requires sunshine and fresh air as much as yours does. Swimming or jumping is wonderful for him if he enjoys it, but regular walking will keep him in good condition. Regularity in exercising is most important. It is far better to take him half a dozen blocks each day than half a dozen miles on Sundays. Extended walks should not be undertaken immediately after meals, and he should always be taken out on his leash. If he tends to put on weight, reduce his food intake or step up his exercise. If it is impossible for you to give him daily walking exercise, a device like that shown in the illustration will provide it for him in complete safety. Not only your dog's size, but his temperament and the food he consumes have a bearing on the amount of exercise he should have. In primeval days the dog was forced to take a tremendous amount of exercise merely in finding his food. Under today's domesticated conditions he cannot possibly digest either the quantity or quality of food that he could in his wild state. More and more authorities are leaning to the belief that today's meat alone is not a suitable diet for the dog. Far better for him are the prepared, well-balanced high quality dog meals, rich in all essential food elements, to be found on the shelves of the corner grocery. A dog fed on such food receives complete nourishment and requires nothing else save water.
