### MORE CHILDREN'S APPAREL ON WAY

America's consumers from six months to 16 years - not to mention their mothers - will be cheered by the fact that the WPB has taken further steps toward allocating materials in its third infant's and children's apparel program calling for production and distribution of roughly 30,000,000 units from Dec. 1 through Feb. 28. Outerwear, pajamas and underwear of low cost goods of durable quality is stressed. Apparel is expected to be available during the first quarter of 1945.

### SUMMER WORKER LOSS HITS WAR WORK

The return of students and teachers to their classrooms, plus women who have gone back to being housewives and workers who have quit wartime jobs to go into post-war jobs with the notion the war is about over has resulted in

a seasonal loss to war plants of over one million workers. Despite concern over this loss, government officials agree that the return of students to schools is in the best interest of our democracy.

### SOLDIERS BETTER EDUCATED NOW

Americans in this war are better educated than those who fought in the last war, it is reported by the U. S. Office of Education. Median level of education of soldiers in this war is the second year of high school, whereas that level was only the sixth grade grammar school in the last war.

### TOBACCO PRICES REPORTED FIRM

Prices continued steady to slightly higher on the N. C. and Va. flue cured tobacco markets WFA reported, as sales continued heavy under spirited bidding and increased demand for all types.

All belts are now marketing the cream of the crop, with about 85 percent of the total eastern belt crop already auctioned, WFA said. The markets thus closed one of the best weeks of auctioning since the season for the three belts opened. All markets will observe a four-day week this week.
