## Homemakers Hints

Clothing specialists offer these suggestions to make woollens last longer: Give it a brush off often in the air, in the direction of the grain of the cloth, inside and out, and in and around the pockets. Hang woollen clothes outdoors when weather permits.  
 Hang clothes straight on the hanger - rip plaquets and buttons.  
 Regular cleaning before garments become badly soiled, helps lengthen wear. Remove spots before pressing as heat may "set" spots so they will never come out. Steam press with a moderately hot iron, too hot an iron may scorch even through a cloth.  
 Protect woollens from pests.  
 Mend clothes in time. Tiny holes are easier to hide than big ones and a thin piece reinforced may never break through; and always repair with care.
