Homemakers Hints

Clothing specialists offer these suggestions to make woolens last longer: Give it a hrush off often in the air, in the direction of the grain of the cloth, inside and out, and in and around the pockets. Hang woolen elothes outdoors when weather permits.

Hang clothes straight on the hanger - rip plackets and button.
Regular cleaning before garments become badly solled helps lengthen wear. Remove spots before pressing as heat may "set" spots so they will never come out. Steam press with a moderately hot iron, too hot an iron may scorch even through a cloth. The Protect woolens from peats.
