Sponsored By C. of C. W. The Council of Church Women of the three churches of Kenansville sponsored a Bible Verse Contest in the Kenansville School during the past year. A reward was given to the child in each grade who memorized the most Bible verses during the period of four

months. Mrs. Perry Dobson, Chairman of the Council, states that there was much enthusiasm and cooperation among the school children, especially of the grammar school age. Miss Alice Hill Reeves taught a course in Bible in her classroom and had a required number of verses, approximately fifty, to be memorized before the course could be passed and thirty-eight members of her class passed the course. Miss Lela McDonald, teacher of the Seventh Grade, had twenty children in her class who memorized one hundred verses each. A number of others in the school memorized as many as one hundred verses, and three children in the school memorized 300 verses each. Rewards and materials for this contest were financed by the

Council of Church Women, The Woman's Club and the Parent-Teachers Association.
