In order to be legally acceptable, Miss Martha Faison returned home after visiting in Bluefield, shoe stamps must be torn from the War Ration Book in the presence of the merchant or his employee. OPA pointed out also that enforcement action would be taken against merchants found in violation, adding that this would entail suspension of their right to deal in rationed shoes.
