Merchants Given

Scale Advice

Raleigh, July 31.—C. D. Baucom, superintendent of the Weights and Measures division of the State Department of Agriculture, has warned North Carolina merchants to be on the alert in the purchase of used scales now being sent into this State for resale.

260 of these scales have been tested and less than four percent were found to be in "workable" condition.

Of the 260 scales examined, 150

were found in Goldsboro, 10 in Raleigh, and 100 in Charlotte.

Baucom said his inspectors are now "on the trail" of others which have been shipped into the State in recent weeks.

Superintendent Baucom pointed to the need for additional scales in North Carolina, but pointed out that "we cannot accept scales which were condemned elsewhere."

"Any person purchasing scales from anyone other than a legitimate scale dealer should make certain they are in good condition. He explained that the Scale Mechanic Act was set up to protect

against the practices of unscrupulous, incompetent, and fraudulent "self-named" scale mechanics.

He said the law forbids the sale or moving of any condemned scale until it has been put in a satisfactory weighing condition.

YAM AVERAGE IS DOWN 10 PERCENT

Producers have reduced the acreage of sweet potatoes in this State 10 per cent from last year, according to the Crop Reporting Service.
