### SEPTEMBER RATIONS

#### FOR LIQUOR IS ANNOUNCED

The September liquor ration for North Carolina's 25 ABC counties was announced this week by State ABC Chairman Carl L. Williamson for next month is as follows: Coupon 37 and 38 will be valid any time during the month of September for one quart or one fifth each, or two pints or two tenths each, of any whiskey or Scotch.

Coupons 39 and 40 will be valid any time during the month for one quart or one fifth each, or two pints each of gin, or one fifth each of Private Stock, Prince George, Five Stripe or Cedar Brook.

Imported and domestic specialties, imported and domestic brandy, rum cordials, fruit flavored gin, fruit flavored brandy and Sloe Gin will be ration free.

#### Raleigh Office Announce Tire Quota Off

The Raleigh OPA District's September quotas of tires will be smaller and quotas for passenger car tires will not be advanced until at least October 1, it was announced.

OPA said that an estimated 20,000 unfilled applications for passenger car tires are in the hands of rationing panels in Eastern North Carolina. This is an increase of almost 100 percent in previous demand for tires.

Although eligibility restrictions have been eased, the supply of tires is not at the point yet where tire quotas can be increased.

The new eligibility set-up is on the basis of occupational services, quota limitations, and proof of need established. Another extension of eligibility permits issuance of purchase certificates for tires to be used on house trailers

that have been and are being used as living quarters. Heretofore, such certificates were issued only if the occupant of the trailer was employed in essential war work.

OPA stated that full control over tire rationing will continue to be in the hands of local boards, with purchase certificates being issued in the following cases:

1. Passenger cars used for occupational purposes.
2. Passenger cars used for non-occupational driving, provided the local board decides denial of the application would cause undue hardship and the total of certificates does not exceed five percent of the board's monthly quota. Denials of the hardship applications cannot be appealed.

#### R. E. Garner

R. E. Garner, age 76, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. J. C. Brock in Warsaw after an illness of a week and in declining health for several years.

Mr. Garner moved to Warsaw 57 years ago and was married to Miss Minnie Tucker who died on May 1st, 1940.

He was for 23 years the Manager of the J. M. Peirce Manufacturing Company and was engaged in the mercantile business for 10 years. He was an active member of the Warsaw Methodist church for almost fifty years having served as Superintendent of the Sunday School and on the Board of Stewards for a number of years.

He is survived by three children, Mrs. Luther C. Hollingsworth of Goldsboro, Mrs. J. C. Brock and Jesse Quinn Garner of Warsaw, one brother, Owen D. Garner of Ft. Myers, Fla., and ten grandchildren six of whom are now in the armed forces.

Funeral services were held at the home Tuesday afternoon at 4 o'clock, conducted by Rev. A. M. Williams, pastor of the Warsaw Methodist Church. Interment was in Pinecrest Cemetery.
