

Coltrane Lauds Farm Groups

Raleigh, Oct. 7.—Declaring that the State Grange and the State Farm Bureau Federation are both conducting membership drives in this State, Assistant Agriculture Commissioner D. S. Coltrane has outlined the following 10 "pertinent reasons" why farmers should join a farm organization:

"In union there is strength; farmers must be organized to hold their own with other organized groups; farm organizations work toward securing for farmers a fair share of the consumer's dollar; farm groups watch over the legislative interests of farmers; farm organizations give farmers a voice in state and national affairs; farm organization is the most effective way to register support for the various agricultural agencies; farm organization work effectively for better rural schools; they stand on the principal that taxes should be levied on the basis of ability to pay; farm groups strive to raise the standard of farm living; and the leading farmers of North Carolina are found in farm organization memberships."
