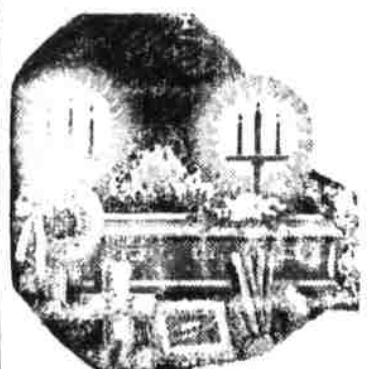

## SERVICEMEN CAN GET TWO SHOE COUPONS

Servicemen leaving the armed forces may obtain shoe ration stamps from any ration board in the country instead of having to wait until their return home, it was disclosed this week.

Up to now, they have been required to apply to their home board for two shoe stamps to which they are entitled.

This change in the ruling liberalizes the shoe ration regulations as a special service to veterans who may not return home immediately after a discharge, but who are getting back into civilian clothes.
