ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING \$110,000 REFUNDING BONDS OF THE TOWN OF WARSAW

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Warsaw, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. That pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, bonds of the Town of Warsaw of the maximum aggregate amount of \$110,000 are hereby authorized to be issued for the purpose of refunding valid existing indebtedness of said town incurred for necessary expenses within the meaning of the Constitution of North Carolina and evidenced by the following described bonds of said town which are redeemable at their face amount on any January 1st prior to their maturity: \$49,000 General Refunding Bonds dated January 1, 1937 and payable January 1, 1967, and \$61,000 Water, Light and Sewer Refunding Bonds dated January 1, 1937 and payable July 1, 1967.

Sec. 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds herein authorized shall be annually levied and collected.

Sec. 3. That a statement of the debt of said town has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

REFUNDING BONDS

Sealed bids will be received until 11 o'clock a. m., E. S. T., November 27, 1945, by the undersigned at its office in the City of Raleigh, N. C., for the following bonds of the Town of Warsaw, N. C., dated December 1, 1945, maturing annually on June 1st in the years hereinafter stated, without option of prior payment:

\$49,000 General Refunding Bonds, maturing annually \$1,000 1947 to 1963, \$3,000 1964 to 1971, all inclusive, \$4,000 1972 and \$4,000 1973.

\$61,000 Water, Light and Sewer Refunding Bonds, maturing annually \$2,000 1947 to 1956, \$3,000 1957 to 1963 and \$2,000 1964 to 1973, all inclusive.

Denomination \$1,000; principal and semi-annual (J & D I) interest payable in lawful money in New York City; coupon bonds registerable as to principal only; general obligations; unlimited tax; delivery at place of purchaser's choice. There will be no auction.

A separate bid for each issue (not less than par and accrued interest) is required. Bidders are requested to name the interest rate or rates, not exceeding six per cent per annum in multiples

of one-fourth of one per cent. Each bid may name one rate for part of the bonds of either issue and another rate or rates for the balance, but no bid may name more than three rates for each issue and each bidder must specify in his bid the amount of bonds of each rate. Each rate must be bid for bonds of consecutive maturities. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder offering to purchase the bonds at the lowest interest cost to the Town, such cost to be determined by deducting the total amount of the premium bid from the aggregate amount of interest upon all of the bonds until their respective maturities.

Bids must be enclosed in a sealed envelope marked "Proposal for Bonds" and be accompanied by a certified check upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable unconditionally to the order of the State Treasurer of North Carolina for \$2,200. The right to reject all bids is reserved. The approving opinion of Storey, Thorndike, Palmer & Dodge, Boston, Massachusetts, will be furnished the purchaser.

In the event that prior to the delivery of the bonds the income received by private holders from bonds of the same type and character shall be taxable by the terms of any Federal income tax law, the successful bidder may, at his election, be relieved of his obligations under the contract to purchase the bonds and in such case the deposit accompanying his bid will be returned.
