Railroad on the East, Beginning at a stake in the A. C. L. 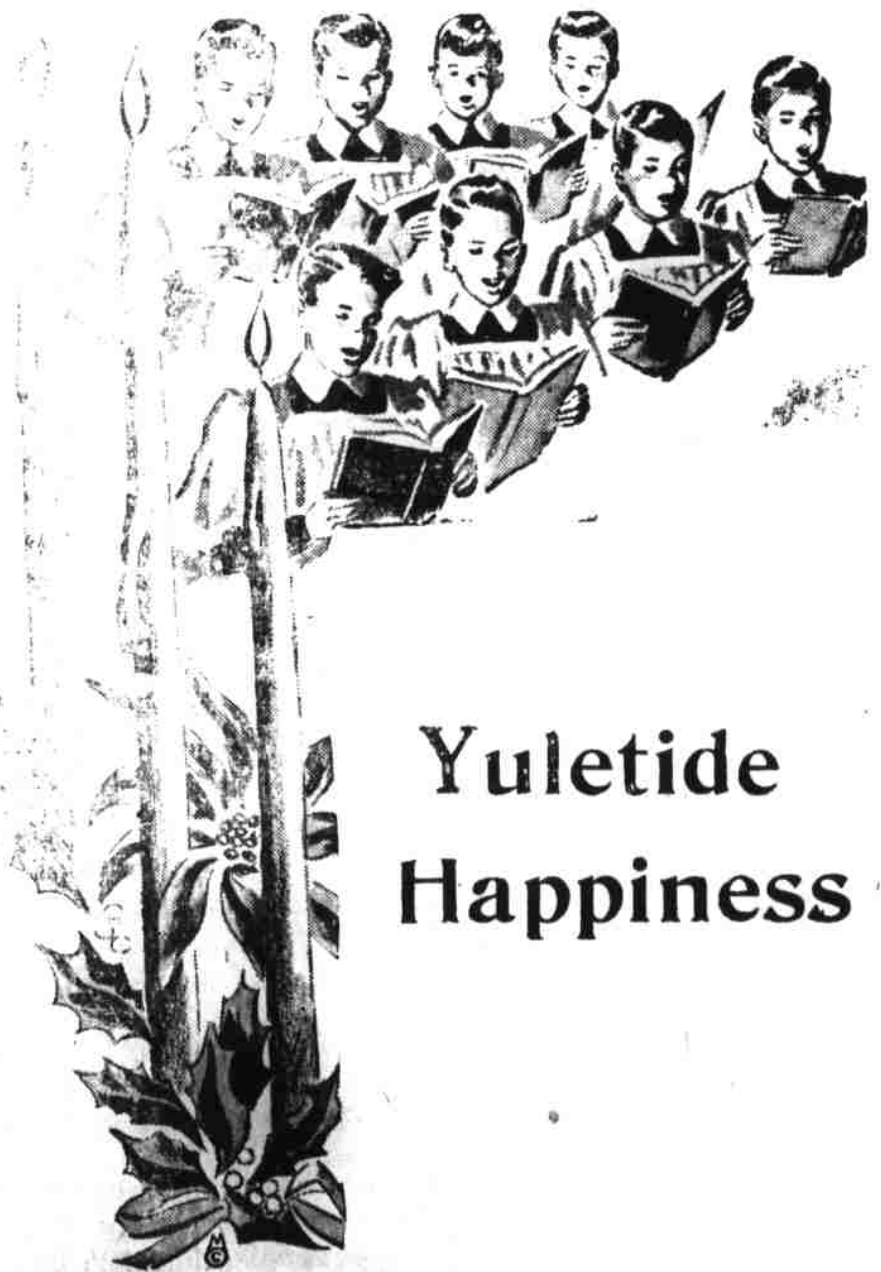
