N. C. Nurses Announce Counseling And Placement Service Now In Effect

The North Carolina State Nurses' Association is happy to announce that the Counseling and Placement Service, which was inaugurated January 1st, is ready to go into action throughout the State. In order to reach all nurses, five cities have been selected to serve as local contacts for this service, Asheville, Charlotte, Raleigh, Winston-Salem, and Wilmington. In each city a local person has been selected as Secretary of Counseling Service, whose duty it is to make appointments for conferences with the State Counselor, and also to give out available information concerning this service to all those who nurse or expect to make nursing their profession, and

also to all employers of nurses. For the Central Area, including Districts 5, 6, 7, and 8 of the North Carolina State Nurses Association, the Headquarters Office in Raleigh will serve for the location center. Appointments can be secured by writing or phoning Miss Mary Lee Beck, Secretary of Counseling Service, 415 Commercial Building, Raleigh, N. C., Telephone 3-3083.

The Counselor, Miss J. Virginia Miles, R. N., M. N., will give two days of Counseling and Placement Service in Raleigh, May 13 and 14. This service is free to all nurses and employer of Nurses. The goal of the North Carolina State Nurses' Association is to have every

available nurse filling a position in which she will be happy and give the best service.

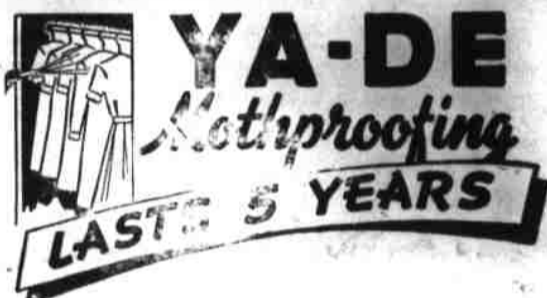
